

NATIONAL FOREST ANTI-FIRE RULES EFFECTIVE TODAY

Permits are now required for all camp fires excepting at improved and designated campgrounds. Permits may be obtained easily from any forest officer. Campers are required to carry an axe, shovel and water bucket. Fireworks are not allowed in the forests.

"While these few regulations must be rigidly enforced, the greatest emphasis should be placed on carefulness," forest headquarters said. "In the last analysis, regulations are useless unless care is exercised at all times in the forests during the fire season. Be careful with campfires, matches and cigarettes. We solicit the co-operation of the public in saving our forests and all their many resources. Remember the forest watchword: Be Careful."

Indian Mound Uncovered
PHOENIX, Ariz. (UP)—An ancient Salt river valley Indian burial ground has been discovered by Lee Gamble, power shovel operator on a state

highway construction job on the Salt river near Mesa, Ariz. Gamble said he uncovered pottery, corn grinders, and crumbling bones about two feet under the surface.

INTERCOASTAL SERVICE PLANNED BY SHIP LINE
PORTLAND, July 1.—(AP)—F. W. Isherwood, Portland district manager for the Coastwise steamship line, said yesterday five former Baltimore mail liners taken over by the Panama Pacific would be reconditioned and put into service on an intercoastal freight and passenger run.

The first sailing will be from Baltimore August 1 and New York August 6. Isherwood said his company had been appointed Portland and Seattle agents for the new service.

COPPER MINE REVIVAL CAUSED BY PRICE HIKE
NEW YORK, July 1.—(AP)—A boost in prices of copper and zinc and announcement of plans for reopening some closed copper mines in the United States marked broadening demand for industrial metals today.

Kennecott Copper, the leading home producer, disclosed it expected to reopen its big Utah mines August 1, giving employment to about 3500 men after shutting down recently to avoid further accumulation of surplus stocks.

JACK WAHL RESIGNS AS HILL MILITARY COACH
PORTLAND, July 1.—(AP)—Jack Wahl, director of athletics at Hill Military Academy for 11 years, resigned today.

He originated such athletes as Glenn Cunningham, Gene Venzke, Earl Meadows, Cornelius Johnson, Norman Bright and Don Leah. Wahl, recently named principal at the academy, said he had withdrawn because of "conflicting views on policy."

ORDERS FOR LUMBER INCREASE IN MONTH
SEATTLE, July 1.—(AP)—The West Coast Lumbermen's association said today during the past month a gradual improvement has been shown in the volume of orders taken weekly by west coast lumber mills. Lumbermen attribute the improvement to scarcity of stocks in the coasting centers and extremely low prices on the west coast, the association said.

GROCERY STORES ISSUE STATEMENT SUNDAY CLOSING

To make their position clear on the policy of remaining open for business Sundays, Gates and Lydiard, Safeway Stores and Luman Brothers issued the following statement in Thursday's Mail Tribune under the caption: "Shall Medford Food Stores Open or Close on Sundays—It's Up to You."

"For the past two weeks we have been open for business on Sunday. We did this for the sole purpose of arousing public sentiment against a growing evil which has resulted in many Oregon cities becoming wide-open Sunday towns.

"Several groups, including the Ministerial association, have expressed themselves. We appreciate their co-operation but that isn't enough. To keep Medford Food Stores closed on Sunday, buying on Sunday must be discouraged. Only by the continued activity of the various groups can we continue our policy of Sunday closing.

"Sunday opening is something we don't believe in and do not want, but the wishes of the public will govern our future action. "Until further notice our stores will be closed on Sunday—only by your continued support can we maintain this policy.

"Confine your food buying to the six regular business days."

The stores making this statement will remain open until 10 p. m., Saturday, close on Sunday and open again on the Fourth of July, according to the announcement.

Women Break Record
MOSCOW.—(AP)—A world airplane broken-time distance record for members of their sex is claimed by three soviet women. Paulina Osipenko, who is a lieutenant in the army air force, with Vera Lomaka and Marina Raskova, flew 1085 miles in nine hours, 32 minutes over a course, Sevastopol, Epatoria, Ochkakoff-Sevastopol, on the Black sea coast.

8-Foot Bear Bagged.
JACKSON, Wyo.—(AP)—Old timers of the famed Jackson hole country of Wyoming say the grizzly bear that Charles Craven killed recently is bigger than any ever captured before in this region. The bear, killed on Polecat creek, was 97 1/2 inches from nose to tail tip, a spread of more than eight feet.

CLAIMS REDS RAN SHIPS' WIRELESS

NEW YORK, July 1.—(AP)—Joseph P. Ryan, president of the International Longshoremen's association (A.P.L.) charged today that the radio rooms of every ship leaving American ports in 1937 were under the control of the communist party.

Senator John J. McNaboe, chairman of a legislative committee before which Ryan testified, asked the witness if he meant "that it was their intention to cripple the steamship industry?"

"Positively," said Ryan. "I claim that every ship leaving this country was in the hands of a communist radio operator. That was one year ago."

Since then, Ryan said, a few unions, the Commercial Telegraphers association, has taken up the fight

against the American Radio Telegraphers, which he said was headed by a communist, and that recently many of the communists have been given out of their jobs and veteran employes reinstated.

LEGION JUNIORS DROP JUNIOR CRATER TILT

The Jackson county Junior American Legion baseball team played its second practice game of the season yesterday afternoon at the high school park, dropping a 1 to 3 decision to the Medford junior Craters.
