SAN LUIS OBISPO, Calif., July 2.—(AP)—W. R. Hurst, the publisher, called California his home today after maintaining his legal residence in New York for several years because of objections to this state's tax laws.
Hearst notified County Assessor W. M. Hollister that his San Simon estate near here was his legal residence as of January 1, 1938.
With the notification letter was a statement listing \$1,366,300.25 in solvent credits subject to taxation against him as a legal resident, bringing his total assessable property in San Luis Obispo county to \$3,000,900.

DAUGHTER DOUBTS F.D.R. RUN AGAIN

BUTTE, Mont., July 2.—(UP)—Mrs. Anna Roosevelt Boettiger, daughter of President Roosevelt, tonight said she didn't think her father would run for another term.
The president's daughter and her husband, John Boettiger, paused here briefly en route to Seattle for the wedding of her youngest brother, John, and Nancy Clark, at Nahant, Mass.

"Father is feeling fine," she said. "I haven't seen him looking so well for a long time. I don't think he will run for another term. It's a wearisome grind, campaigning."
Asked her opinion of a magazine article representing another brother, James Roosevelt, as making \$250,000 to \$300,000 per year in the insurance business, Mrs. Boettiger frowned and said, "I certainly am not pleased about it." She declined further comment.

JOY TURNS TO WORRY IN MONTANA DELUGE

BUTTE, Mont., July 2.—(UP)—Montana farmers' joy at plentiful spring and early summer rains turned to apprehension tonight as statewide reports told of hay rotting on the ground, meadows turned to mud-fields, and irrigation ditches filled with sand.

DEATH IN BATHTUB PUZZLES POLICE

SAN JOSE, Cal., July 2.—(UP)—Police tonight investigated the possibility of murder in the death of Clarence Blauer, 51-year-old executive of the California Packing corporation, who was found shot to death in the bathtub of his hotel room today.
The investigation was asked by two brothers, William Blauer, San Francisco banker, and George Blauer, rancher, who said their brother had no reason to take his life. They said he was well-to-do, and apparently happy.
Blauer was found in the bathtub by a chambermaid. His body was clothes but clothed. Nearby was an old revolver. Police said the shot which killed him entered his head from the rear and emerged through the side of his forehead. Investigators said they were puzzled because suicide victims seldom fired a gun from this angle.

Prialux, Chiloquin, said in a letter today that he was "in no sense a candidate for re-election" to the office of state chairman of the republican party but that if a majority of the committeemen desired that he serve a third term, he would do so even "at a continued personal sacrifice to my business."
Prialux, a newspaper man, said he considered it "our duty" to maintain an active opposition party "whose members should endeavor to protect and preserve our sacred heritage which are now being slowly undermined."
