NEW YORK, July 8.—(AP)—The stock market experienced its most substantial setback today since the mid-year bull movement began June 20.

After leading issues had lost \$1 to \$3 a share, however, there was little improvement in the last hour, and at the finish few issues were down more than \$2 a share.

The pace of trading slackened on the decline. The day's turnover of about 1,500,000 shares compared with 2,700,000 yesterday.

Business news of a character to affect the market was meager, and brokers described the sell-off as a normal reaction after the 25 percent increase since June 20.

A favorable development was the weekly report of the movement of freight, which showed a larger gain than the normal seasonal jump for the period.
