

BATTERED VESSEL WILL BE FIRST UP BONNEVILLE LOCKS

Dedicate World's Highest Single-Lift Sealock—Big Celebration Is Planned

PORTLAND, July 8.—(P)—A wave-battered, unromantic freighter, the sturdy Charles L. Wheeler of the coastwise trade, rolled seaward in the Columbia river swells today to dedicate the world's highest single-lift sealock, cross a mountain between jagged rock walls of a gorge and complete a historic journey to the Dalles, a new port 200 miles from salt water.

The Wheeler, 3800-ton vessel of the McCormick Steamship company, will rest in the locks of the \$51,000,000 Bonneville dam 40 miles east of here with the U. S. coast guard cutter Onondaga of Astoria tonight.

Big Celebration Planned. They will enter the upper river early Saturday after dedication ceremonies at the locks, and sail under the slim, graceful bridge of the gods at Hood River, gateway to a celebrating inland empire of eastern Oregon, Washington and Idaho.

The Wheeler, first vessel to sail the upper reaches of the great river of the west since its discovery by Captain Robert Gray and his ship Columbia, 146 years ago, will carry a cargo of salt, sugar and automobiles to the interior. It will return with the rich products of the wheat, cattle, lumber and orchard country.

The journey will inaugurate an ocean cargo service made possible by Bonneville dam. The vast power and navigation project will provide a direct link between the land behind the Cascade mountains and the Pacific ocean. Since the start of modern transportation, the inland empire has been unable to overcome the navigation hazards at Cascade rapids. The rapids had disappeared in the great lake formed behind Bonneville.

Governors Aboard. Aboard the Onondaga at the lock dedication and the celebration at The Dalles will be Governors Charles Martin of Oregon, Clarence Martin of Washington and Barzilla W. Clark of land-bound Idaho.

Twenty thousand persons will witness the dedication and the marine parade through the gorge. Hastily prepared transmission lines will carry the first commercial electric energy from Bonneville dam Saturday to Cascade Locks, Ore., and North Bonneville, Wash. The two river towns planned the street-lighting service with the passage of the Wheeler.

Bonneville dam, started in 1934, was completed last December. Its sealock, 76 feet wide and 300 feet long, has a lift of 66 feet from low water. Although the Wheeler has removed an 80-foot mast to pass under the bridge of the gods, army engineers will drop the river's level four feet to assure clearance.

FRUIT RETAILERS WILL BE TAUGHT SELLING OF PEARS

SEATTLE (Sp.)—How to sell fall and winter pears will be taught eastern retailers this season through a comprehensive manual now in preparation. The Oregon-Washington-California Pear Bureau announced today.

Cleverly illustrated with cartoons by A. L. Benfro, Seattle artist, the manual will be unique. One typical cartoon shows a pear talking to a banana and saying "What's good for you is good for me." Bringing home the point to retailers that they would not sell green bananas and should not sell fall and winter pears until they are ripened like bananas, Roy Webster, who is assisting it

preparation of the copy in conjunction with the bureau's advertising agency, said that the publication will be as complete as possible, particularly stressing the value of proper handling, ripening and display of pears.

This is the first time that a retailer's manual has been prepared for pears, although a leaflet on "How to Handle Fall and Winter Pears" was published by the bureau last season. The advertising agency, however, has prepared many manuals for the fruit industry, including an apple and pear export manual and a retailer's manual on apples which has been used as a training book in instructing clerks in chain stores throughout the country.

DANGER OF FIRES BEHIND RULING ON FOREST CLOSURES

SALEM (Sp.)—Conditions permitting the rapid spread of fire were the basis of Gov. Charles H. Martin's recent proclamations closing certain forest areas in Oregon. Debris on the ground, wind-blown timber, standing snags and inaccessibility all combine to facilitate the swift spread of fire during the summer months.

In issuing the closure proclamations, the governor acted under authority of state law. The proclamation included areas adjacent to the Deschutes, Fremont, Mout Hood, Ochoco, Rogue River, Siskiyou, Umpqua, Whiteman, Willamette and Umatilla national forests.

DANGER OF FIRES BEHIND RULING ON FOREST CLOSURES

Under this closure order, all en-

trants are required to comply with all of the following requirements or conditions: (1) to refrain from smoking while traveling in such areas, except on paved or surfaced highways; (2) to secure a permit issued by the forester or a fire warden before building a camp fire other than at improved, designated and posted camp grounds on such areas; and (3) to have as a part of his equipment when using camp fires, except when traveling as a pedestrian or camping at improved, designated and posted camp grounds, tools as specified by the forester suitable for extinguishing fires.
