

ALL FIRES UNDER CONTROL IN WAKE THURSDAY STORM

All of the fires set by lightning on the Rogue River national forest late Thursday afternoon were either out or under control yesterday, Medford headquarters announced.

Additional food supplies were sent into the fire-fighting crews Friday night. A tractor was sent from here to clear a roadway to one of the fires on the Unquiqua divide.

Two additional lightning-caused fires were discovered late Friday afternoon. Both were on the Unquiqua divide a few miles east of the Tiller-Trail highway.

The electric storms that had been predicted for Friday afternoon and night did not develop.

Fire hazards increased materially in several sections of the forest yesterday and headquarters asked the public to be extremely cautious in forest recreational areas over the week-end.

Marion Nance, junior forester injured while on fire duty, was treated by a doctor here yesterday. The injury was not serious.

CABIN HOME NEAR BUTTE FALLS IS FLAME DESTROYED

BUTTE FALLS, July 9.—(Sp.)—A three-room frame cabin on the Kincaid ranch at Rancheria five miles east of here was completely destroyed by fire this morning. Practically everything in the house also was destroyed.

Rogue River national forest personnel and other volunteers saved the other buildings on the farm and kept the fire from spreading to adjacent timber land.

The farm is owned by Frederick M. Kincaid, Los Angeles attorney, and is managed by his brother, Roscoe Kincaid, who occupied the cabin.

The fire was spotted and reported by both Virgil Clark, Ruttler Peak forest lookout, and his brother, Robert Clark, Fredenburg lookout.

The lookouts reported by telephone to Paul Brinson, district ranger of the Rogue River national forest at Butte Falls, who dispatched a fireman with equipment from the South Fork CCC camp.

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FOREST SERVICE NOW IN CONTROL HIGHWAY BEAUTY

The United States government has accepted title to the Crater Lake highway scenic addition to the Rogue River national forest and all the rules and regulations of federal forests now apply to the added area, it was announced yesterday by forest headquarters here.

The added area comprises about 8,700 acres and lies on both sides of Crater Lake highway between Prospect and Union Creek. The land was acquired to retain highway scenic values in an exchange arrangement with the Rogue River Timber company.

The government's acceptance of the title is the final step in a long fight to avert logging of the area and to preserve its scenic assets. Solution of the controversy was ultimately found by the United States forest service in the exchange agreement.
