

WILL START WORK ON LAKE O' WOODS ROADS NEXT WEEK

\$25,000 Allotted for Forest Project—Camp Is Established at Lake—To Use Parts of Old Routes

With an allotment of \$25,000, work will be started early next week on the Dead Klamath Falls and the road from Klamath Falls to Lake of the Woods. Rogue river national forest headquarters announced today.

A workers' camp was being established today at Lake of the Woods and between 33 and 40 men will be employed all summer on the dual project, headquarters stated. The work will be done under the supervision of W. L. Jones, forest construction superintendent. All of the men needed for the work have already been employed, headquarters emphasized.

Both roads lead to Lake of the Woods and the work will be started on the roads from the lake, forest headquarters said. Most of the routes will be new and through timbered land in accordance with a U. S. bureau of public roads survey.

When the work is completed the roads will be 16 feet wide with a nine-foot surface. With the present scale of cash allotments, however, it will require several years to complete the roads. This year's fund will permit work up to about November 1, forest headquarters stated. Although the fund is viewed as small for this type of work, it is the largest allotment received for road building by any of the national forests in Oregon or Washington. If the fund allotments are increased in future years, construction can be accelerated.

It is not expected that the new roads will be ready for use this year. Although new routes will be followed in the main, parts of the old roads will be utilized. The new roads will unite with county roads.

For years there has been considerable agitation on the part of the public in the Rogue river valley and Klamath Falls for improved roads to Lake of the Woods. Leader in the agitation has been the Lake of the Woods Summer Home association.

The present roads are narrow, crooked, rough, dusty and generally in bad condition.
