

STATE MINING BOARD WILL SEEK \$100,000 FOR NEXT BIENNIUM

PORTLAND, July 15.—(AP)—The state board of geology and mineral industries will ask the legislature for a \$100,000 budget for the next biennium, the directors determined today.

The request will be similar to the allotment granted when the legislature created the board two years ago. An off-the-record discussion, however, revealed the board contemplated changes in the division of funds, particularly as they affected grubstake loans. In the last budget, \$40,000 was assigned to grubstake.

The board will ask the state industrial accident compensation commission to readjust the rates applying to surface and underground workers. The director, Earl Nison, was authorized to apply for reductions for mill employees.

No relief can be extended the chambers of commerce at Grants Pass and Baker for maintaining an exhibit at the San Francisco exposition in 1939 unless sufficient funds were available to assure a worthwhile display.

BRITAIN ORDERS 1000 WAR PLANES

BIRMINGHAM, Eng., July 15.—(AP)—Sir Kingsley Wood, minister for air, today ordered from Baron Nuffield, Britain's foremost automobile producer 1000 Spitfire fighting planes.

This was the government's first order of aircraft from the philanthropic motor magnate who was estranged from Wood's predecessor, Lord Swinton, who resigned under fire. The new minister moved quickly to make peace with Nuffield.

LONDON, July 15.—(AP)—Sir John Simon, chancellor of the exchequer, told the house of commons today that "if we don't succeed, and the world does not succeed in finding some way in which we can stop the folly of this ever-increasing expenditure on armaments, then, indeed, the future we are preparing for our children is one at which we may shudder."

Clerks Strike In Grocery Concerns

PORTLAND, July 15.—(AP)—Sewerly Safeway stores and four subsidiary concerns were affected today by a strike of the Grocery Clerks' union, affecting more than 600 workers.

Melcolm McLeod, clerks' secretary, said the shutdown might spread to Safeway units at Multnomah, Tigard, Gresham, Forest Grove, Milwaukie, Oswego and Beaverton.

The strike was called last night by the union and the central labor council after negotiations for renewal of expired contracts were broken off.

Capitol Site Adds Frizzell Property

SALEM, July 15.—(AP)—J. M. Devers, attorney for the state capitol reconstruction commission, said yesterday the Allice B. Frizzell property, needed as part of the enlarged capitol site, had been purchased for \$14,000.

Devers said a condemnation suit would be dropped. Mrs. Frizzell had demanded \$25,000 for the property, while the commission offered \$10,500.

Earlier this week a jury awarded Mrs. Luella M. Charlton and Mrs. Hal Patton \$45,000 for the old Patton home.

Atlantic Seaboard Lashed By Storm

NEW YORK, July 15.—(AP)—A lashing rain storm and gale-like winds left a trail of havoc along the middle Atlantic seaboard today, racing across southeastern Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware and the eastern shore of Maryland, the storm, accompanied by lightning, flooded scores of homes, scattered fishing boats helter-skelter, ripped off roofs, felled trees and damaged corn fields and orchards.

Mayor Walter J. Sweeney of Sea Bright, N. J., estimated the damage in his town, including the clean-up cost, at \$100,000.

SWEDEN BOASTS PLANE CAPABLE OF 465 MPH

WASHINGTON, July 15.—(AP)—Americans heard today Sweden had an aviation motor capable of making 465 miles per hour at altitudes up to 59,000 feet.

The American commercial attaché at Stockholm advised the commerce department that the new motor was a 12-cylinder, inverted V model, turning up 1900 revolutions per minute. It is equipped with special compressors to compensate for low air pressure at high altitudes.

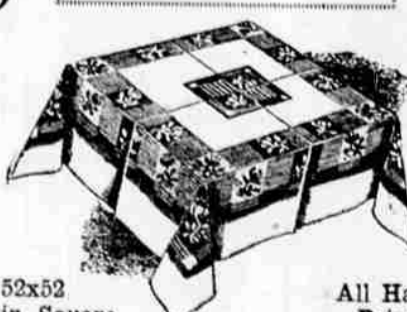

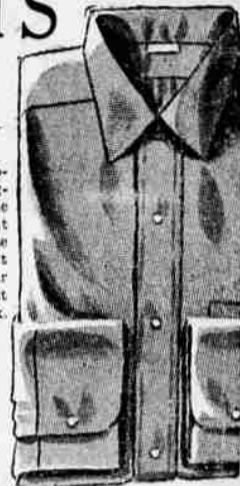
