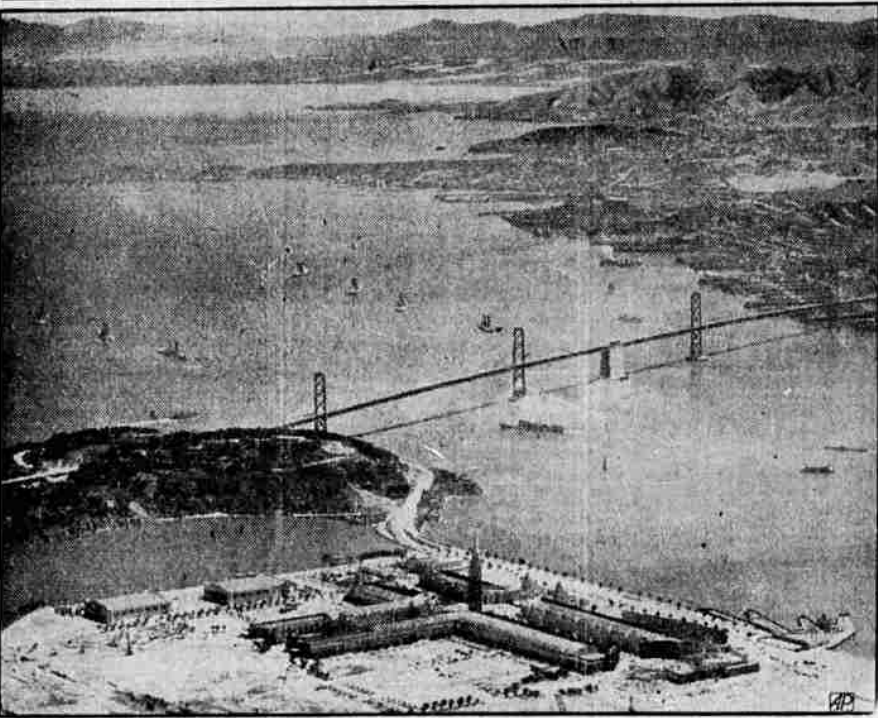
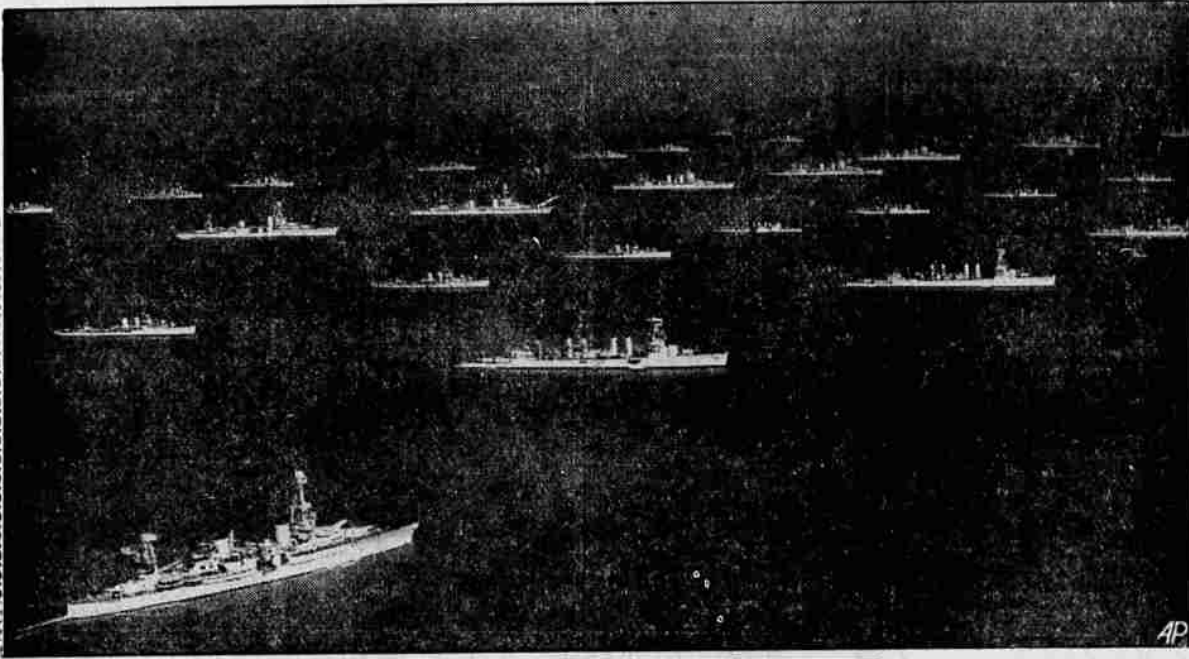
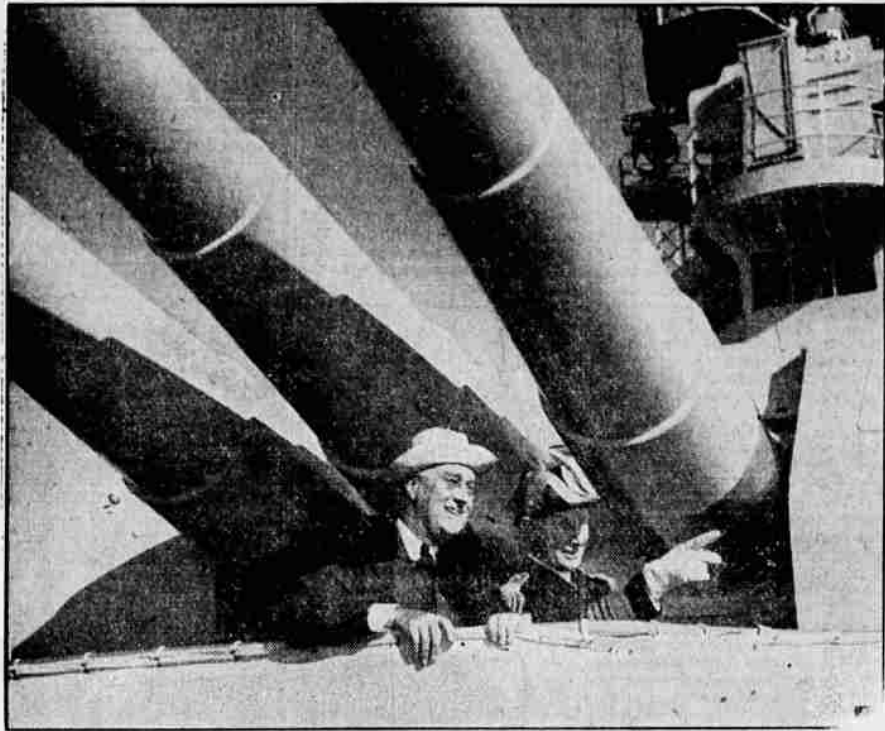


President Reviews Fleet, Visits Treasure Island in San Francisco Bay
