"Treasure Island" Returns To Screen At Rialto Sunday

Robert Louis Stevenson's immortal story of pirate gold and adventure, "Treasure Island"—probably the greatest adventure ever filmed—returns to the Rialto theatre for today and tomorrow only as the result of millions of requests that the great sea drama again be shown on American screens.

Against a background of the scientific knowledge and disease-fighting weapons 20 centuries of medical progress have put at the medical profession's command, the film traces the U. S. doctor's training and establishment of practice; the problem of making his skill and learning available to all those in need. This pictorialization is based upon the actual lives of doctors and has been documented by medical consultants who cooperated in the production.

Also shown in the film are the various plans which have been suggested to assure adequate medical care to all U. S. people.
