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RUMANIA REMAINS LAND OF MYSTICS AND WEIRD RITES

Slavic Strain Imbues Country With Mysticism - Strange Sects Exercise Influence Over Peasants

By F. C. M. Jahn (United Press Staff Correspondent) BUCHAREST (UP)—Owing to Slavic strain in its blood, the Rumanian nation is deeply imbued with mysticism.

The peasants, upward of 80 per cent of the population, still hear superhuman voices in the purr of brooks and in the rustling of trees. Occasionally, "heavenly apparitions" speak from the clouds in the skies to shepherds and wanderers in lonely forests and mountains.

The ordinarily peaceful and patient peasant easily becomes fanatical if he feels hurt in his creed or in other religious convictions. This disposition makes him an easy prey for sham prophets and unscrupulous agitators.

Hiets Over Calendar To adopt Rumania's time computation to western standards, the government, eight years ago, put through a calendar reform and replaced the Julian calendar, observed in the eastern Greek orthodox countries, by the Gregorian calendar.

This implied setting forward the date by two weeks. At once 14 calendar saints thereby lost their old-established honors and their income.

This intervention of a terrestrial government in the established order of heaven sufficed to cause serious local protests. Despite numerous missionaries, dispatched by the patriarchate to educate the rural population, even today in some districts of the provinces of Besarabia and Bucovina, peasants continue their passive resistance to the new calendar.

They boycott churches and priests on movable holidays, while attending service on Sunday's, because the latter were not affected by the reform, the change being one of exactly two weeks.

Strange Sect. Among the cab drivers of Bucharest and lassy are found a number of stout, bearded men with pronounced Slavic features. They are Skoptzi, members of one of the queerest sects in the world's religious history.

The Skoptzi (literally "Bunuchs") whose principles are based upon the teachings of Egyptian anachorites of the first centuries A. D., consider sexual love for its own sake a sin. As soon as a son is born to continue the family—daughters do not count—the husband submits to an operation which makes reproduction impossible while the wife has her breasts removed.

The Skoptzi sect was founded in northern Russia in the early 17th century whence it spread with rapidity. The most drastic measures, including the actual use of fire and sword, employed chiefly under Peter the Great and Nicholas I, proved of no avail.

Fled to Rumania. In flight from persecution, thousands of members of this sect, chiefly from the Rumanian province of Orel, came to Rumania in the middle of the last century.

Because they were excellent horsemen, most of them chose the profession of cab drivers.

They kept apart from the rest of the population and the government tolerates their strange customs because they do not interfere with military service and other civic obligations, and because the Skoptzi are a law-abiding and peaceful group.

Another sect, chiefly composed of people of Russian origin, are the Lipovani who live in the estuary of the Danube. They are mostly fishermen and enjoy the reputation of being particularly skilled in their trade.

They deny the divinity of Christ whom, like the Mohammedans, they consider as a saintly man. They also are conscientious objectors.

They possess no higher ecclesiastical authorities than priests, who are elected by the communities and ordained by fellow priests.

The short hallway is decorated with red and gray stripes, and the glass in the door is etched with scribbles which resemble the African's conception of the Palmer method of penmanship.

In the theater proper, the wainscoting is striped with black, red, yellow, gray and old blue. The upper part of the walls is scrawled with some more African jargon. The gray wooden ceiling has a huge sunbeam running out and into the gray radiations. Doors all are striped in the African manner—diagonal, varicolored stripes.

The "usherettes" all chosen for their beauty, wear brilliantly striped futahs—kocofutahs, direct from Africa—and they have tinkling anklets dangling from bare legs and all carry African water bottles, refreshment for the audience.

Karamu—which, incidentally, is the Swahili word for "house of recreation and entertainment"—operates on a season budget of about \$2,000. However, many plays shown there have sold out to such capacity crowds—the theater holds only 133 persons—that hundreds have been turned away.
