### JACKSONVILLE'S PLEA FOR WATERWORKS AID GOING TO WASHINGTON

PORTLAND, July 22.—(AP)—C. C. Hockley, regional director of the public works administration, advised northwest cities and communities today only 90 days remained to file applications for construction funds. This year's PWA regulations established midnight, September 30, as the filing deadline. Work must start prior to January 1 and projects must be substantially completed by June 30, 1940. The following applications will be

forwarded to Washington: Oregon—Waterworks system at Jacksonville, grant, \$22,500; loan, \$27,500; total cost, \$50,000. Waterworks system at Halfway, grant, \$8543; total cost \$14,540.

Weather Adds Bumps ORLANDO, Fla.—(UP)—Dry weather here had its effect on city employees. Mayor Sam Y. Way ordered city employees driving through Orlando streets to halt their cars and replace bricks found standing on end in the streets. The paving bricks were loosened by warm weather, which melted tar holding them in place.
