

BLOOD SPILLS ANEW AS JEWS, ARABS DISPUTE HOLY LAND



IN PALESTINE, THE HOLY LAND—"Holy" to Moslems, Jews and Christians who for centuries have lived there, each group retaining its own customs—is Tel Aviv, a street of which is shown above. Tel Aviv, all-Jewish city, has been established about 25 years, has a population close to 125,000, and is near Jaffa. Tel Aviv figures inevitably in stories of Jewish-Arab disturbances which spring from the plan for a Jewish national home in Palestine to shelter Jewish refugees, and from the Arabs' deep-rooted conviction that Palestine is their own land.

Governor Charles H. Martin will be visited at the state capitol in Salem Monday morning by two pretty members of the Oregon Shakespearean Festival association's company of actors who will take part in this year's series of plays in the Elizabethan theater at Ashland.

The Medford actresses, Doreen Levetrie and Dorothy Pruitt, will interview the governor at the new state house at 10 a. m. Monday. They will present him with the No. 1 honorary membership card for the 1938 season. Complimentary tickets for this year's series of Shakespearean plays will also be presented for the governor and Mrs. Martin. Governor Martin is honorary president of the association.

The scene with the governor will be a colorful episode in the governor's routine of state business and plans have been made to have news cameramen present to photograph the group. The Medford girls will be attired in costume. Mrs. Pruitt, as Ophelia in Hamlet and Miss Levetrie as Bianca in The Taming of the Shrew.

Arrangements for the interview were made by long distance telephone by Walter H. Levetrie, business manager of the association and father of Miss Levetrie, a student at the Cornish school of drama in Seattle.

A Shakespearean good-will tour will be made of the girls' trip to Salem. The actresses, wearing their costumes, will leave here Sunday morning by motorcar and en route to the capital will call at hotels to leave literature on the Shakespearean festival which will open on August 5 with Hamlet and close August 13 with the same play.

On the return trip the girls will call at newspaper offices in the cities along the route to publicize the festival. Last year Governor and Mrs. Martin attended one of the Shakespearean plays and an effort will be made to persuade them to come to Ashland for the festival again this season.

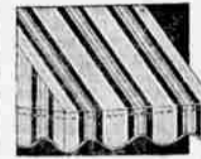

EIGHT BIG CRUISERS IN PORTLAND HARBOR

PORTLAND, July 22.—(AP)—The flagship Indianapolis led seven other heavy cruisers into Portland harbor today for the city's observance of an annual fleet week. With the big ships were eight modern destroyers, led by their flagships Arcton and Phelps.

Two destroyers, the Eane and Perry arrived Wednesday, while three auxiliary boats steamed in yesterday. They were the repair ship Modius, hospital ship Reiser and the supply ship Arcton.

The visit will bring between 7,500 and 10,000 officers and men here for a week.
