

Freddie Bartholomew, Mickey Rooney In Dramatic Craterian Picture

BRITISH MERCHANT MARINE FILM WILL STAR YOUNG ACTORS

Freddie Bartholomew and Mickey Rooney, whose exploits together delighted thousands in "Captains Courageous", are teamed again in a dramatic story of the training of boys for the British Merchant Marine, in "Lord Jeff", story of the sailors of the future, which opens a three day run today at the Cool Craterian Theatre.

LUMBER INDUSTRY IN STATE SHAKY

PORTLAND, July 23.—(AP)—The fluctuation of employment and wages in the state's biggest industry, lumber, was graphically illustrated today in a study of the state planning board on Oregon's industrial employment.

For the period of a year, October 1, 1936, to September 30, 1937, the monthly payroll of the lumber industry dropped from a high of \$4,055,809 in June to a low of \$2,205,085 in January. Employment reached its peak in July, when 29,804 were at work, and hit a low of 22,030 the following February.
