## PERKINS INTERVENES IN MARITIME STRIFE

WASHINGTON, Aug. 5.—(AP)—Secretary Perkins intervened today in a controversy among the maritime commission, the new maritime labor board and the National Maritime Union (NIO) over duplication of employment offices for sailors.

## LOVE LETTERS OF DWYER'S EX-GIRL READ AT HEARING

Missives Protest Love for Youth Who Accuses Her Father of Murdering Elderly Doctor and Wife

**SOUTH PARIS, Me., Aug. 5.—(AP)**—Love letters written by Barbara Carroll, 18, to Paul N. Dwyer, 19-year-old "killer" were read today at the trial of the girl's father, former Deputy Sheriff Francis M. Carroll, for the murder of elderly Dr. James G. Littlefield.

Dwyer had testified that Barbara had written him letters in which she accused her father of improper conduct and that under threats he had returned two letters to Carroll. The state contended Dr. Littlefield's alleged knowledge of Barbara's letters provided a motive for the crime.

One letter barred. Five letters were offered in evidence today. A sixth, from which one page was missing, was ruled inadmissible by the court, sustaining a defense objection.

The letters were found in Dwyer's bag when he was discovered asleep in Dr. Littlefield's car, which also contained the bodies of the physician and his wife, at North Adirongton, N. J., last fall. Dwyer admitted he at first took full responsibility for their deaths, but at the current trial placed the entire blame upon Carroll.

In one of the letters Barbara expressed regret for "intimacy" with Dwyer, but also termed the pale youth "the sweetest kid in the world" because he "still loved me after everything has been done."

Always Be Waiting. In another, she said she loved Paul "with every part of my body."

In still another the girl wrote she knew Dwyer "would keep still about it, even if you hate him."

One letter quoted the girl as saying "I gave you everything I could," and declaring she would "always be waiting for you."

Dwyer, who previously testified to a great fear of Carroll, asserted he

expressed the hope, upon his arrest in New Jersey, that the then deputy sheriff would not be sent to bring him back to Maine, because "I was afraid he would throw me out of the plane."

## POLICEMEN SLAY TRAPPED BANDIT

**HOT SPRINGS, Ark., Aug. 5.—(AP)**—Trapped in a hotel room, Earl Young, 28, Lebanon, Pa., desperado wanted in four states for robbery, kidnaping, rape and murder, was shot to death here today by two city policemen.

Young was identified from fingerprints by H. B. Fletcher, agent in charge of the Little Rock office, FBI; and Bill Kaufman, Hot Springs police department fingerprinting expert.

The fugitive died in a hospital three hours after he was felled with a bullet in the head and a wound in the ankle during a gun battle with Police Captains Jerry Watkins and Ben Rogers.

Fletcher said Young was wanted for the kidnap-murder of 17-year-old Betty Schindler near St. Charles, S. D., July 29, for kidnaping and robbing a young girl taken from Louisville, Ky., to French Lick, Ind., on July 12, and for robbery, car theft, and jail breaking at Lebanon, Pa., three months ago.
