

OREGON FSA LOANS REACH \$2,708,159 FOR FISCAL YEAR

PORTLAND.—(Sp.)—Oregon farm families aided by the farm security administration totaled 7,505 at the end of the 1937-1938 fiscal year July 1 as the program of the United States department of agriculture to place low-income and handicapped farmers on a self-sustaining basis assumed a permanent status under the Bankhead-Jones farm tenant act, Clifford L. Smith, state director, announces.

Loans for livestock, machinery, feed, seed, cooperative facilities and other capital goods totaling \$2,708,159 have been extended to 3199 Oregon farmers unable to secure credit from other sources by FSA and the former resettlement administration. Collections on loans, the majority scheduled for repayment over a five-year period, totaled \$575,540, with over 83.5 per cent of maturities due being met and 274 loans paid in full.

"A farm and home plan worked out by the borrower in cooperation with the county FSA supervisor provided a balanced livestock and cropping program for each farm, maximum home production of family food needs and record keeping to provide a guide for efficient management," Smith said.

County adjustment of farm debt services available to all farmers in the state resulted in adjusting debts of 845 families from a total indebtedness of \$2,139,086 to \$1,332,287, together with payment of \$84,112 in back taxes. Adjustments were effected by consolidation, refinancing and time extension brought about through friendly negotiations between debtor and creditor.

Attacking the rapid growth of farm tenancy, six tenant-farm purchase loans were made in Linn county this year and improved tenure agreements were negotiated for 754 farmers.

Yamhill farm resettlement project begun by the resettlement administration, was completed by FSA and 107 farm families transferred from submarginal areas or inadequate acreages relocated.

Special assistance, including guidance, FSA loans and grants, has been extended to hundreds of drought families seeking to establish themselves in Oregon.

42 FISH CAUGHT IN CRATER LAKE ON BANNER DAY

A report from Superintendent E. P. Leavitt's office indicates that the cessation of the spawning mood in Crater lake trout apparently increased the creel of anglers manifold during the past two weeks.

The banner day of the season for fishing was July 25 when 42 trout and silverside salmon were caught. These 42 were caught by 15 anglers who fished a total of 24 hours. They used eight boats in their activities. From these data it follows that 1.8 fish were caught by each boat per hour of angling on that particular day.

During the week July 24-31, three rainbows were caught that weighed 7 lb. 9 oz., 7 lb. 8 oz., and 6 lb. 8 oz., respectively. Their respective ages were 8, 8, and 7 summers. This shows that these particular fish gained about 1 pound per year of life while in Crater lake.

Angling in Crater lake during this season has found most success by trolling with the Dave Davit flasher type lure. Doc Shelton, Andy Rickers and troutermen have had fair success.

Deep trolling, with the aid of copper line, at depths of 200 feet has proved successful.

PROTESTS ARE HEARD ON MIDWAY DISTRICT BY-PRODUCT STENCH

The state department of agriculture was holding a hearing today into the protests of residents of the Midway road district, against odors arising from the operations of the Southern Oregon By-Products company, located about three miles northeast of this city. A. W. Metzger, assistant chief of the state agriculture department is conducting the hearing.

The by-products company is engaged in the reducing of dead animals to tallow for soap, a stock food, and other items. The protestants allege the smell is repulsive and annoying, impairs the value of their property, and is injurious to their health. The testimony showed it was worse in the evening when the air is quiet.

A half dozen witnesses testified Thursday afternoon when the hearing started, and as many more were due to be called today. The hearing, expected to be concluded today, was started last June, when it was adjourned.

The only objection registered is to the odor arising from the cooking process. It is contended this can be eliminated by using different operation methods.

Sardine-Stuffed Eggs
Cheese-Filled Celery Sticks
Cold Boiled Tongue
Vegetable Salad Bowl
Rolls
Ripe Olives
Raspberry Shortcake
Coffee

Sardine-Stuffed Eggs
12 hard-cooked eggs
1-3 cup sardines
1/4 cup minced celery
1 tablespoon minced pickle
1 teaspoon lemon juice
1 tablespoon salad dressing
1/4 teaspoon salt
Cut eggs in half lengthwise. Remove and mash yolks with a fork. Add the rest of the ingredients to the yolks. Roughly refill the egg white cases. Chill. Garnish with minced parsley and a dash of paprika. Serve.

Cheese-Filled Celery
18-six-inch celery sticks
1-3 cup Roquefort cheese
2 olives, chopped
1/4 teaspoon paprika
1/4 teaspoon minced parsley
2 tablespoons cream
Mix together the cheese, olives, paprika, parsley and cream. Stuff celery and chill. Arrange spoke-fashion on a flat plate or tray. Garnish with cress or parsley.
