

# Errol Flynn As "Robin Hood" In Craterian's Technicolor Classic Today

"The Adventures of Robin Hood," filmed entirely in Technicolor, opens a three day showing today at the Craterian theatre, with Errol Flynn heading a cast of thousands. One of the most important pictures of the year, it has been acclaimed by critics and public as a masterpiece of screen entertainment.

The robust adventure, deeds of daring and heroic exploits which have made the story famous through the years, is given full play on the screen. Set in the year 1190, when the treacherous Prince John was ruling the country and oppressing the Saxon elements, while his brother Richard was away at the Crusades, the picture opens with a jousting tournament at Nottingham Castle, where Robin Hood defeats Sir Guy of Gisbourne and at once becomes Sir Guy's foremost enemy and the Maid Marian's delight.

It is then that Robin Hood organizes his crew of Merry Men and hides away to Sherwood Forest, from which he forays to rob the rich and bestow a third of his takings upon the poor. Constant danger from those who desire to seize the throne when they hear of Richard's capture, and much merriment in their forest home, make the lives of Robin Hood's crew an exciting one. And when they finally besiege Nottingham Castle and overthrow Prince John and his fellow conspirators, the picture is brought to a rousing finish.

As Robin Hood, Errol Flynn is said to be perfect. Olivia de Havilland is the Maid Marian; Basil Rathbone portrays Guy of Gisbourne; Claude Rains is Prince John; Patrick Knowles is Will Scarlet; Eugene Pallette is the roly-poly Friar Tuck; Alan Hale the lovable little John; Melville Cooper the High Sheriff of Nottingham; Ian Hunter Richard the Lion-Hearted; while others include Herbert Mundin, Una O'Connor, Montagu Love, Robert Warwick and Ivan Simpson.

**John Carroll Tops  
Cast of Thrilling  
Romance at Rialto**

A new star blazes in the Hollywood heavens as John Carroll rides and sings his way to fame in "Rose of the Rio Grande," the thrilling romance at the Rialto theater for today and Monday. Movita shares starring honors.

The story concerns a Mexican bandit—a man of the people, leading a band of outcasts against the despots of his country. He is known only as El Gato. "The Cat of the Mountains," and his vengeance strikes terror into the hearts of the poor rebels who are ravaging his native land. When he learns that Roasia, his beloved, is being detained at a rebel camp, El Gato races to save her life, and enters the enemy camp as an insurgent general.

Excitement ensues as Roasia is doomed to die, her lover forced to pronounce sentence, and tension mounts to a thrilling climax when the bandit chief discovers that the "general" is the famed El Gato, whose name means death to any rebel.

As the added feature on the twin bill, the Rialto has Glenda Farrell and Barton MacLane in "Prison Break."

MacLane is shown as a tuna-fisherman who assumes the burden of another man's crime and is sentenced to San Quentin. For his heroic share in the suppression of a murderous prison riot and wholesale jail-break, he is paroled. But imprisonment has left its mark and honest employment is something he is unable to secure. How his problem is finally solved marks the climax of the story.
