

FISHING IS GOOD IN FOREST AREAS; FIRE CARE URGED

The following recreational bulletin was issued today by Rogue River national forest headquarters:

"Fishing has been good in the south fork of the Little Butte creek near Dead Indian Soda Springs. Best luck has come by using grasshoppers on the riffles.

"Good catches of rainbow have been taken during the week at Rocky Point on Klamath lake with all kinds of plugs and with Andy Reekers. Fish have been running from three to 12 pounds. Lake O' Woods reports good catches of perch and catfish, though few bass or silverides. The bass are still spawning. Bass and catfishing is improving at Hyatt lake as the water becomes lower.

"Fourmile lake, Fish lake and the Sky lakes report only fair fishing. Note that the season at Fish lake closes August 15. In the Seven Lakes basin, good fishing is reported in Grass lake with Bucktail flies and spinners, while it is only fair in Middle lake and Cliff lake. Good catches have been taken from Mud lake in the Blue canyon on Bucktail Gaddis flies.

"Limit catches have been made in the middle fork of the Rogue river with flies and single eggs. Fishing is fair in the upper Rogue river, Muir creek and Foster creek with some good catches being taken by small spinners, eggs and flies.

The huckleberries still have not reached their prime. In the vicinity of Gypsy Springs and Round lake in the Butte Falls district they should be ripe about the 20th of this month. In the Huckleberry mountain area, they should reach their peak in another week. The pickers have already taken up to three gallon per person before noon.

"Because the huckleberry and hunting season will bring numbers of visitors to the forest, great care is requested with the use of fire. The public cooperation fire record is considered excellent in the Medford and adjacent areas. Not only have very few fires been man-caused, but almost an equal number have been reported to rangers or put out by forest visitors. It is hoped that the good work will be continued."

59.6 PER CENT OF BUDGET EXPENDED

The first seven months of the year, ending July 31, Jackson county had expended 59.6 per cent of the budget, according to the report of the county clerk's office completed Thursday. A balance of \$182,013.61, or 40.4 per cent of the budget remained.

Expenditures for relief funds, including the county farm, totalled \$48,553.32, up to the end of July. This also includes old age assistance, blind assistance, miscellaneous relief, children's aid and other help items. It is estimated relief for the year will approach the \$90,000 mark.

All county offices and departments are well within their budget allowances.
