

GRANDMOTHER OF G.O.P.'S CANDIDATE 100-YR. OLD TODAY

SALEM, Ore., Aug. 13.—(AP)—Tomorrow the grandmother of Charles A. Sprague, Republican candidate for governor, will celebrate her 100th birthday anniversary.

Her Oregon grandson will be unable to attend the birthday celebration, though he visited her in June and found her in a fair state of health.

Mrs. Brooks was born near Marietta, Ohio, migrated with her parents to Illinois and, following her marriage, to Iowa.

She held her family together, reared them, and after the death of her second husband, John Brooks, has made her home with her children, two of whom survive.

BRITAIN DAMAGED BY FREAK STORMS

LONDON, Aug. 13.—(AP)—Over-coated children threw snowballs in Yorkshire today. In Norfolk the snow was two feet deep, the result of two days of freak storms that cut a crazy path across England.

UNVEIL MONUMENT MONDAY IN HONOR OF WILL ROGERS

BARROW, Alaska, Aug. 13.—(AP)—A memorial so constructed it may in time serve as an aerial beacon was rushed to completion today in preparation for Monday's ceremonies honoring the late Will Rogers and Wiley Post, killed near here three years ago in a plane crash.

The 15-foot high monument, made of stone taken from the same quarry as Oklahoma's state memorial to Rogers at Claremore, is equipped with a conduit which will make future illumination possible.

The stone, two by three feet, is pink granite and weighs 800 pounds. It will overlook the lagoon where the famed humorist and aviator met death.

A seven foot square base three feet thick was erected on frozen clay beneath the bleak tundra. The base was designed by Vivienne Kellems, daughter of Dr. Homer F. Kellems, owner of Kellems' ranch in Delaware county, Okla. Miss Kellems is an art student at the University of Oklahoma.

Other persons here for the dedication are the Rev. Roy E. Curtis, Christian church, Hillsboro, Tex., and formerly of Pryor, Okla., Wilmer F. Sims, Hillsboro merchant, John Kayser, Chickasha, Okla., and Clarence Lee, Fort Scott, Kas. They will assist the Rev. Kellems.
