

THIRD OF VISITORS IN ASHLAND PARK ARE MEDFORDITES

Survey Shows Average of 3,000 Visit Park on Sundays—Many Also Checked From Klamath Falls.

ASHLAND Aug. 16.—(Sp.)—Complete figures released by the board of directors of Lithia park indicate that an average Sunday brings approximately 3,000 persons into the park. Visitors from Medford generally constitute about one-third of the total, far outnumbering local residents who enjoy the scenic beauty of their own park.

Registration is based on a combined survey taken on two recent week-ends, July 31 and August 14, when all cars were counted as well as the number of persons in each and the number of pedestrians entering the park by the footpaths.
