

### WESTINGHOUSE CO. LOW BIDDER ON CONTRACT FOR LARGEST DYNAMOS

DENVER, Aug. 19.—The Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing company of Pittsburgh was low bidder on building the world's three largest electric generators, to be installed on the Grand Coulee project in Washington, the reclamation bureau announced today.

L. N. McClellan, chief electrical engineer for the bureau, said the Westinghouse bid for the three units was \$2,611,000. The General Electric company of Schenectady, N. Y., was second at \$2,686,489. The Allis-Chalmers Manufacturing company of Milwaukee bid \$2,754,727.

The three generators, far larger than any now in operation, McClellan said, will weigh a total of more than 7,000,000 pounds. They are to be ready for installation in about two years.

Each of the units will have a generating capacity of 108,000 KVA. The largest generators now in operation, those at Boulder dam, have a capacity of 82,500 KVA.

Under specifications announced by McClellan, each unit will have an outside diameter of 45 feet. A rotor 30 feet 6 inches in diameter will move on a 44-inch shaft.

"Eventually, 18 such generators will be installed at Grand Coulee," McClellan said.

### THIRD COVER SPRAY ADVISED BY AUG. 25

The third cover spray for the control of second brood codling moth should be completed on August 25, according to L. G. Gentner, entomologist of the southern Oregon experiment station, and C. B. Cordy, assistant county agent.

This spray should be applied to all apples and to late pears if worms have been a serious problem. It is stated.

Three pounds of arsenate of lead and one-fourth to one-third pound of dry spreader, is recommended.

### Menus of the Day

(By Mrs. Alexander George)  
Frozen Food Toppings  
(Often the sauce makes it a dessert)  
Old-Fashioned Chocolate  
4 squares chocolate (1/4 pound)  
1 cup granulated sugar  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
1 cup water  
2 egg yolks, beaten  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
Cut the chocolate into small pieces. Add the sugar, salt and water. Cook slowly and stir constantly until the mixture blends well for one minute. Add the yolks. Mix thoroughly and cool. Add vanilla. Pour into a jar. Cover and store in a cold place.

Fruit Surprise  
1/2 cup crushed pineapple  
1/2 cup raisins  
1/2 cup diced peaches  
1 cup granulated sugar  
2 tablespoons flour  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
1/4 cup orange juice  
1/4 cup pineapple juice  
2 tablespoons lemon juice  
1/4 cup water  
Mix the fruits, sugar, flour and salt. Add the rest of the ingredients. Cook slowly and stir constantly until the mixture thickens. Boil for one minute. Cool and store.

Caramel Pecan  
2 cups dark brown sugar  
2 tablespoons flour  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
1/2 cup cream  
1/2 cup boiling water  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1/2 cup pecans (toasted)  
Mix the sugar, flour and salt. Add cream and water. Cook slowly and stir constantly until the sauce becomes thick and creamy. Cool. Add the rest of the ingredients and store in a covered jar in the refrigerator.

Minted Chocolate Sauce  
2 squares chocolate  
1 cup dark brown sugar  
1/2 cup granulated sugar  
1 tablespoon flour  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
1 cup water  
1/4 cup milk  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
5 drops mint extract  
Mix together the chocolate (cut fine), the sugars, flour and salt. Add water and milk. Cook slowly and stir constantly until the sauce thickens and becomes very creamy. Cool. Add the rest of the ingredients. Cover. Store in a cold place.

### SPINSTER SISTERS SUICIDE TOGETHER

BOISE, Idaho, Aug. 18.—(AP)—Katherine and Marguerita Helfrich, middle-aged spinster sisters, were found hanging in the attic of their home here yesterday.

Police Chief J. Emer Harris reported a note, addressed to an aunt and signed by the sisters, said they "couldn't stand it any more."

Harris said the sisters tied electric cords around their necks and to the rafters, then jumped off chairs.

Coroner J. T. McCann identified the sisters as daughter of the late Mrs. Agnes Josephine Helfrich, who gained national distinction as a china-painting artist nearly two score years ago.

Both the sisters were born in Ogden, Utah. Katherine, 54, was chief clerk for the late Gov. James Haw-

ley in 1911 and 1912. Margaret was 50.

In recent years Katherine had operated a boarding house; Margaret had been giving art lessons.

The only close relative is a brother, W. E. Helfrich, believed to live in Portland, Ore.
