TOMATO CANNING FACTS GIVEN IN TALK TO KIWANIS

Manager of Bagley Cannery Says Industry Now First in Volume Among All Fruit, Vegetable Packs

Canned tomatoes and tomato products rank first in volume among all the fruit and vegetable packs of the United States, Ralph E. Kooser, manager of the Bagley Canning company, of Ashland, told the regular weekly luncheon-meeting of the Kiwanis club in the Hotel Medford Monday noon.

Mr. Kooser, tracing the history and development of the tomato canning industry, stated that, in the 80 years since tomatoes were first canned in the west, the industry has developed to the point where the annual output is valued at \$20,000,000, or more than 40 per cent of the value of the west's entire vegetable pack. He also said that over 13,000,000 cases, in tin, were packed in the west last year and that almost 100 per cent of the entire American pack of tomato paste and sauce was done in the west.

Maryland First: California, Mr. Kooser stated, produced 85 per cent of the western tomato pack and ranked second only to Maryland as the largest tomato-canning pack in the United States. Utah is second, Colorado third and Oregon fourth among western states, he said.

"In the tomato canning industry there is no such thing as an average year," Mr. Kooser told the meeting. "The crop throughout the country fluctuates widely, demand varies and the national pack, in consequence, has run as high as over 43 million cases last year, to as low as 22 million cases in 1925. These figures include all tomato products."

Divided up last year, the national pack, he explained, was as follows: Canned tomatoes, 21,267,423 cases, tomato juice, 13,444,972 cases, leaving some five million cases of tomato products such as catsup, paste and sauce.

400,000 Acres Required: "Normally a little over 400,000 acres are required to satisfy the needs of the tomato canning industry in the United States," he said, "about one-fourth of these being located in the west."

Mr. Kooser traced the development of the tomato canning industry from the early 1700's until now. He stated the first recorded pack of tomatoes in the west was put up by Francis Cutting, who had established a preserving factory in San Francisco in 1857. The first cannery in the Rogue River valley was established in Ashland in 1902 by Charles Pierce, he stated.

The speaker explained that it was still too early to predict the size of this year's local crop, or the price to be paid growers, but said he believed the crop would be slightly smaller than last year.

Harold Brown, president of the club, presided at the meeting.
