

Dick Powell Has Comedy Role In "Cowboy From Brooklyn" At Craterian

DONALD DUCK'S NEW CARTOON ALSO ON GAY HOLIDAY BILL

What should prove to be ideal entertainment for the Labor Day holiday is the program opening a three day run today at the Craterian theatre.

In the featured spot is "Cowboy from Brooklyn" which, although it starts in a western locale, is definitely not what could properly be termed a "western," for it takes nothing in the western scene very seriously. Dick Powell, Pat O'Brien and Priscilla Lane have the three top roles with Dick Foran and Ann Sheridan also featured.

As an added attraction, Donald Duck brings his three nephews to the screen again in the new Walt Disney cartoon, "Good Scouts," in which Donald takes his nephews on an expedition through Yellowstone, and finds himself getting more than he bargained for in the way of excitement.

Also on the program is an Our Gang comedy, "Hide and Shriek," and one of those always popular historical mysteries—"Tupapoo."

"Cowboy from Brooklyn" tells a hilarious tale of the complications which ensue when a New York theatrical producer, played by O'Brien, comes to a Wyoming dude ranch and assumes that a trio of stranded eastern musicians who dress up in cowboy duds while they entertain the guests are authentic cowboys.

Taking the leader of the trio, played by Dick Powell, back to New York and launching him on a highly successful radio career as a cowboy crooner, he discovers his cowboy is really a Brooklyn youth who has never ridden a horse—a scared to death of them, in fact.

When an enemy of Dick's tries to expose him as a fake, Pat arranges to have the timid Dick ride a "bronc" at a Madison Square Garden rodeo and, in a fantastic and delicious series of events, Pat gets his flatbush cowboys to perform exactly as advertised.

Muscle is plentifully interspersed with the action, with five new song numbers including the popular "Ride, Tenderfoot, Ride."

Bulldog Drummond Adventure Picture Opening At Rialto

The film brings to the screen both of the brilliant 13-year-old Mauch Twins who made such a tremendous hit in "The Prince and the Pauper." Billy and Bobby play Penrod and Danny, leaders of the Penrod Jr. G-Men, who romp through what is said to be their greatest adventure.
