WOLVES STALK CHILD IN FOREST FASTNESS OF MT. HOOD REGION

Portland, Ore., Sept. 8.—(AP)—A. C. Bull, Portland attorney, related today how his sudden appearance prevented possible death for his 4-year-old daughter when she was stalked by two giant timber wolves.

Bull said the incident happened last Sunday in the Mount Wilson section of the Mount Hood wilderness. His wife and another couple had gone down a leafy trail ahead of him. His daughter, Marilyn, skipped down the trail before him, "yelling like all kids will."

"I stepped behind a log to cut a bracket fungus," Bull said. "Suddenly I heard her scream. I looked down the trail to see two timber wolves slinking toward her. They were within 10 feet or so when I scrambled over the log and yelled and waved my arms. They raced into the timber and disappeared."

F. R. WOULD PREPARE WAR POWER SUPPLY

HYDE PARK, N. Y., Sept. 8.—(AP)—President Roosevelt said today the possibility of an electric power shortage in the event of war constitutes "a serious threat to the national security."

This statement was made in letters designating members of a special committee Mr. Roosevelt named to seek "definite ways and means" of providing emergency power facilities.

The president named the following as members of the investigating body: Louis Johnson, assistant secretary of war; Frederick A. Delano of the national resources committee; Basil Manly of the federal power commission; Harold L. Ickes, secretary of the interior and a member of the national power policy committee; Charles Edison, assistant secretary of the navy, and William O. Douglas of the securities commission.
