

### DISCIPLINING OF OFFICER UPHELD

EUGENE, Sept. 9. — (P) — Charges that Officer Arthur Mahany, of the Eugene police force, was "insubordinate" and had been "under the influence of intoxicating liquor while on duty the night of August 14," were upheld last night by the city

civil service commission after a lengthy hearing. Mahany was ordered suspended from the force for a period of 30 days last August 24. Charges were preferred by Chief of Police Carl P. Bergman, who acted on charges made to him by Sergeant Roy Wilcox. Wilcox was the chief witness against Mahany, testifying that on the night of August 14, he smelled liquor on Mahany's breath and that the latter's actions were "not normal." Mahany admitted drinking a small glass of beer with his lunch on the night in question, but denied he was drunk.

### PLAN NEW PROBE MAHONEY CRASH

ALBANY, Sept. 9. — (P) — Reopening of a grand jury investigation into a fatal accident involving Willis Mahoney, Democratic nominee for U. S. senator, was ordered yesterday by Circuit Judge L. G. Lewelling. Thomas L. Zimmerman, Shedd, was

killed in the accident on Nov. 28, 1937. Although a state police officer said at the time of the accident that Mahoney was blameless, Mahoney was charged with reckless driving. The court's order was made "on motion of District Attorney J. K. Weatherford, Jr., for an order referring the matter back to the grand jury for further investigation." Judge Lewelling added that "it appeared to the court from statements in the district attorney's motion that there was misunderstanding by the grand jury as to the law applicable to the matter."

### GUN ACCIDENT TAKES LIFE OF LITTLE GIRL

DALLAS, Ore., Sept. 9. — (P) — Pauline Jean Ronco, 11-year old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Albert Ronco of the Fir Grove district near here, died in the Dallas hospital last night from an accidental gunshot wound in the head. Little Pauline was watching her older brother as he started to clean

an automatic revolver in their home yesterday. The clip had been removed from the gun, but one cartridge remained in the barrel. It discharged, the bullet entering the girl's head through the mouth. Teacher Named ROSEBURG, Ore., Sept. 9. — (AP) — Election of Boyd W. Jackson, La Grande, to teach English, speech and dramatics in Roseburg senior high school, was announced here today. Mr. Jackson will take the place left vacant by the resignation of Miss Kate Buchanan, who is to be employed at University of Oregon campus.

### \$700,000,000 LOAN ASKED BY TREASURY

WASHINGTON, Sept. 9. — (P) — The treasury asked the nation's investors today to lend it \$700,000,000 in "new money" to help pay for the administration's spending program and to build up a huge temporary cash reserve. At the same time, Secretary Morgenthau offered new securities to re-

fund \$433,400,900 worth of notes maturing December 15, bringing the total of the financing operation to \$1,133,400,900. Treasury officials said they anticipated little difficulty in borrowing the money because the banks alone have \$1,000,000,000 of idle funds available for investments and loans. More Work For Uncle WASHINGTON, Sept. 9. — (P) — The civil service commission reported today the executive branch of the federal government employed 10,411 more persons in July than in June. The July total was 663,235.
