## JUDGE HARDY FILM FOURTH IN SERIES WITH YOUNG MICKEY

Probably the most outstanding motion picture series ever to be introduced on the screen are those of the remarkable Judge Hardy Family. ## CANDIDATE SHOT, IS HELD A RUSE

NEW ORLEANS, Sept. 10.—(P)—James H. Morrison, candidate for congress in next Tuesday's Democratic primary, was shot and wounded early today in what he described as a "political" ambush but which Governor Richard W. Leche called a "cheap publicity stunt."

Morrison, who has waged a bitter fight against Dr. J. K. Griffith, incumbent, who is supported by the governor in the sixth district, said he was ambushed at his summer camp seven miles east of Hammond by an unidentified man who escaped. The governor, who took the stump in the district against Morrison, said at Shreveport the "affair is simply a cheap publicity stunt of a desperate, unscrupulous and repudiated politician."

## JAPANESE CLAIM HANKOW LINE CUT

SHANGHAI, Sept. 10.—(P)—The Japanese reported today their long-delayed objective of severing the Peiping-Hankow railway south of the Yellow river was near realization.

They said one of their columns had made a surprise attack to the southwest from the Lungai railway zone in north Honan province and had advanced to within 45 miles of the Peiping-Hankow line.

The column was aiming at a point 65 miles south of Chengchow, junction of the Lungai and Peiping-Hankow lines, the Japanese reported. This would place the column about 200 miles north of Hankow, China's provincial capital.

Severance of the railway was a major goal of the Japanese last spring during their offensive along the Lungai.

## RAIN NO BAR FOR SPANISH ATTACK

HENDAYE, France (at the Spanish frontier), Sept. 10.—(P)—Insurgent forces continued attacks on the government's defense lines in eastern Spain today despite heavy rain which crippled operations.

The exact situation was obscured by conflicting reports reaching the frontier.

A government communique said the insurgents had launched attack after attack, using cavalry as well as infantry and tanks, but all had been repulsed.

An insurgent communique from Salamanca said government resistance had been broken all along the Ebro river front and five lines of fortifications had been captured.

## LOWER GAS RATES EFFECTIVE OCT. 1

Another substantial reduction will be enjoyed by local gas consumers, effective October 1, according to D. E. York, vice president and general manager of Southern Oregon Gas Corporation, who announces customers' savings up to 20 per cent.

"In putting into effect new low rates for schedule 2, domestic heating service, and schedule 4, domestic water heating, we are carrying out the original pledge of our president, Mr. J. A. Ward, that gas rates would be lowered as rapidly as possible consistent with sound management and good service," said York.

"The object of these new, low rates is to encourage increased utilization of gas for all domestic needs through making the advantages of modern gas appliances available to more homes at lower cost."

The utility executive pointed out that these October 1 rate reductions made in the face of steadily rising taxes and operating costs, further substantiate Mr. Ward's economic theory. "In every case when we have cut rates," concluded York, "the demand for gas appliances and gas fuel has rapidly increased. Before long, the growing volume makes possible additional rate adjustments, all old customers sharing the benefits along with new customers."

York asserts that gas fuel, at the new "Schedule 4" rate, provides the lowest-cost modern hot water service ever available in this community.
