### SWISS WILL PROTEST NAZI PLANE FLIGHT OVER CITY OF BASEL

BASEL, Switzerland, Sept. 14.—(AP)—A German plane marked plainly with swastikas flew over this Swiss city near the German and French borders for 10 minutes this afternoon until warned away by angry Swiss guards.

Swiss authorities said an "immediate protest" would be made to Berlin in view of the fact that the prohibited plane over its territory "but violated the rules of other countries."  
The plane first appeared at 1:50 p. m. after having been seen flying low along the German side of the river. After reaching Basel it flew for 10 minutes over four highways and one railroad bridge which have been mined "for destruction in event of foreign invasion."

Guards on the ground by waving their arms informed the pilot he was over foreign soil. No shots were fired. Military authorities said they were convinced it was a "mistake" but Germany must "learn to abide by the rules she lays down for others."

### MARTIN DISPELS CANDIDACY HOPE

PORTLAND, Sept. 14.—(AP)—Any possibility that Gov. Charles Martin might seek to become an independent candidate for re-election in November was dispelled today with an announcement that he and Mrs. Martin had purchased a new colonial type home here.  
The governor said he and his wife would be "back among our old friends immediately after our task at Salem is completed at the end of the year."

Of gleaming white with green shutters, the residence has six rooms and is located on a 90 by 100 foot lot on Southwest 21st avenue, north of the Alingworth school, in the heart of Portland heights, west side residential section.

### FOLDED HEPPNER BANK PAYS 85.35 PER CENT

HEPPNER, Sept. 14.—(AP)—J. L. Gault, receiver for the First National bank of Heppner completed liquidation today with declaration of a fifth and final dividend of 85.35 per cent, to be distributed about September 25.

Liquidation was accomplished by settlement with the government for timber lands at the headquarters of Willow Creek. Payment of the fifth dividend will bring a total return to depositors of 85.35 per cent, or about twice that estimated when the receivership was begun in 1933.

### GAS TAX REVENUE IS DISAPPOINTMENT

SALEM, Sept. 14.—(AP)—Gasoline tax revenues have fallen off this year to such an extent that the

state highway commission might have to postpone \$600,000 in federal aid road projects scheduled for construction next spring, Highway Engineer R. H. Baldock said today.

The commission had estimated that 1938 revenues would be about \$200,000 more than 1937, but instead it appears that the revenues will be about \$300,000 below the commission estimate. The commission paid off \$1,000,000

principal and \$425,645 interest yesterday on its bonded debt, reducing the debt to \$19,591,780, lowest point since 1920.

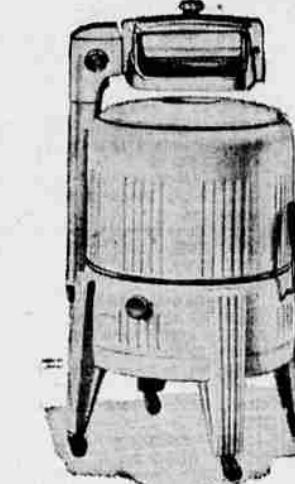

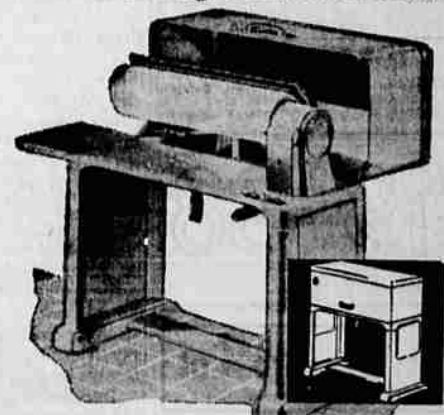
