"Huckleberries are still available at Huckleberry mountain, and a few pickers are continuing to have fair luck in isolated areas around Blue Rock. There is still huckleberry picking in the Applegate.

Route Outlined  
"A trip to Hershberger mountain on the Umpqua divide is suggested at this time. It is reached by traveling to a point about four miles above Union Creek on the Diamond Lake highway, and from there, where a sign shows the turnoff, over a mountain road for a distance of ten miles to the summit. The road is in good condition with no difficult grades.

"The road passes the Rabbit Ears nearly at their base and a short walk will provide an opportunity to reach these two pinnacles. It goes through a valuable stand of sugar and white pine timber where a timber survey crew is at present working on estimates from which will be prepared plans for logging under sustained yield methods. This will insure protection of the stand and provide for logging of the trees as they mature. Blister rust control work is being carried on, through which all cut and gooseberry bushes are destroyed to prevent the spread of this disease to the valuable pines. The camp of the blister rust workers may be seen across the river from the road soon after leaving the highway.

## Central Market Buys Fine Steers

The remainder of the herd of specially fed steers from the Marsh Garrett ranch, which were purchased by the Central Market, will be placed on sale Saturday in the Central meat department, according to an announcement today by J. F. Haws, owner of the market.

"Mr. Haws, who is well known for his scientific feeding of fine beef, gave each steer 22 pounds of cotton seed meal and ground barley a day for 100 days. Two weeks ago a carload of these same steers topped the Portland market. There were 97 other carloads of steers in Portland at that time.

## BLIGHT LAW TEST CASE GETS UNDER WAY AGAIN CIRCUIT COURT MONDAY

The recessed hearing of the suit of Tom L. Taylor, orchardist, against County Agent Robert F. Fowler, Fruit Inspector Howard Warren, and the state department of agriculture, in which the constitutionality of Oregon horticultural laws empowering removal of blighted fruit trees will be resumed before Judge H. D. Norton in circuit court Monday.

The case grew out of removal of six acres of pear trees from the Taylor tract last December by the county agent, upon the ground they were blight infected. Taylor seeks an injunction to prevent further removals. In the original action, Taylor sought \$5000 damages. This phase was stricken from the case at the June hearing, leaving only the legal point at issue.

The county will be represented by District Attorney F. J. Newman and an assistant attorney-general, and Taylor by Attorneys Gus Newbury and Don R. Newbury.
