MAHONEY FAVORS SHIPS, MORE DAMS

PORTLAND, Sept. 19.—(AP)—The potential development of Oregon depends upon a "legitimate merchant marine," Willis B. Mahoney of Klamath Falls, Democratic nominee for the United States senate, said in a talk today before the Portland chamber of commerce. He asserted the state's export trade reached \$70,000,000 annually between 1926 and 1930 but dropped to \$17,000,000 a year between 1932 and 1937. He advised the state to make known its needs and participate fully in the maritime commission's \$100,000,000 program to construct vessels to serve Pacific coast ports. The candidate said he favored the Umatilla dam and Willamette valley flood control projects and added that President Roosevelt might inspect the regions next year.

WASHINGTON C.I.O. FOR THIRD TERM

SEATTLE, Sept. 19.—(AP)—Members of the Washington state CIO council, organized here over the week end, urged a third term for President Roosevelt. No resolution was adopted, the delegates merely approving a motion to "endorse President Roosevelt for a third term." Harry Bridges, west coast CIO director, told the delegates the committee for industrial organization had outgrown its infancy and become a permanent responsible organization. He declared labor's major task is to bring the American Federation of Labor and the CIO together in one large body and on a fair basis. He added "this will be done." He said "we have unity on the political front in many instances but to heal the breach between them, all of us are going to be in a sorry fix."

ASTORIA, Ore., Sept. 19.—(AP)—L. B. Sandblast of the internal revenue department at Newark, N. J., predicted today a bridge would be constructed across the Columbia river near the mouth in a few years. Sandblast, a former Portland attorney, once represented bridge interests at Washington, D.
