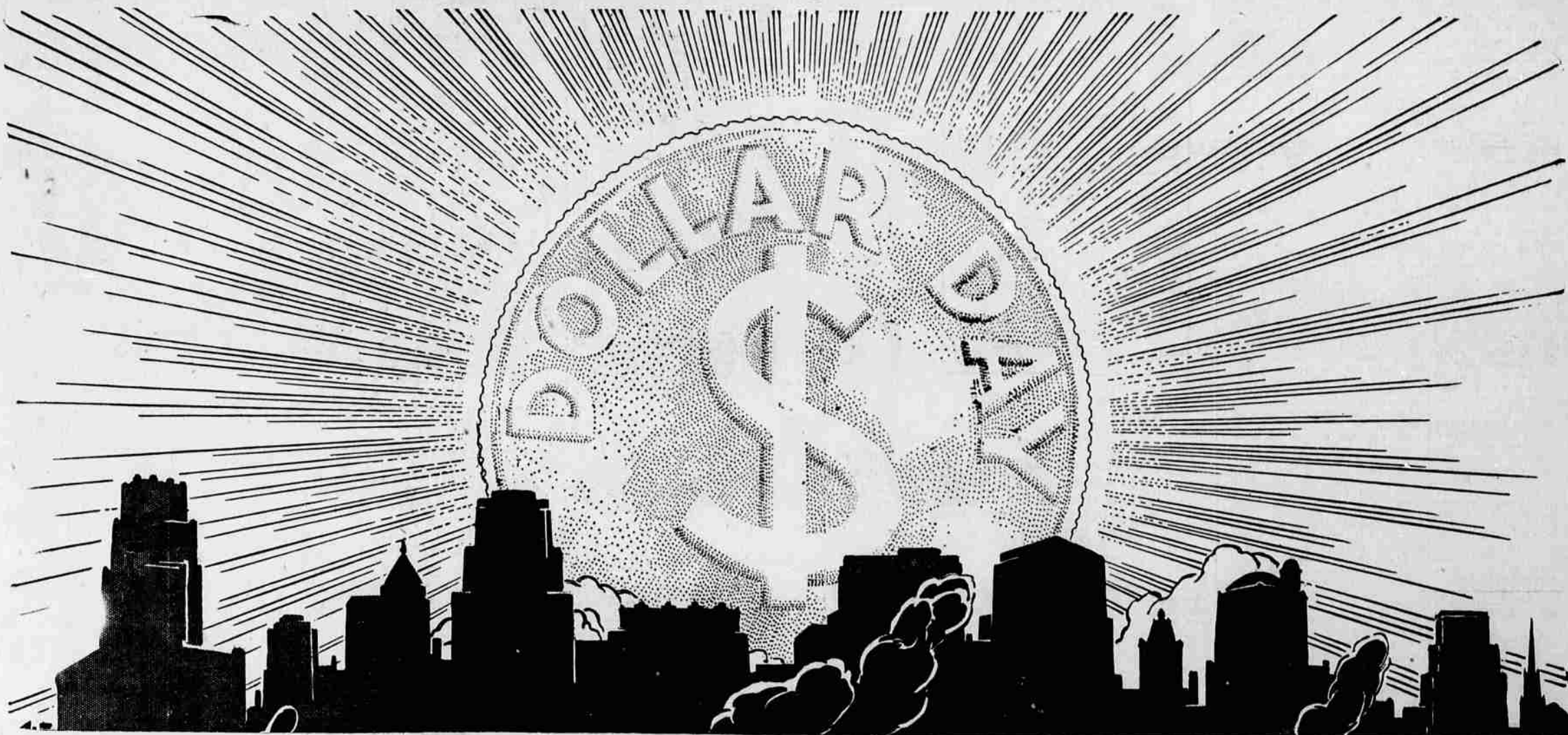

GERMANY GLOATS OVER SURRENDER

BERLIN, Sept. 22.—(AP)—Germany rushed truckloads of swastika flags

toward Czechoslovakia tonight in anticipation of a triumphal entry into Sudetenland. As soldiers streamed eastward to an undisclosed destination the German press heralded the victory. Nachttausgabe, the official organ of Nazi S. S. troops asserted "better nerves" were responsible. "Czechoslovakia's hours are numbered," said Nachttausgabe.

DECISION BACKS DISTRIBUTION OF SURPLUS TO POOR

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 22.—(AP)—Possible groundwork for distribution of surplus American agricultural commodities to "those who need but do not have," was seen today in a U. S. circuit court of appeals decision upholding the government's right to levy a contribution as a consideration for engaging in interstate commerce.

The decision upheld the legality of Secretary of Agriculture Wallace's order governing the marketing of the west coast walnut crop, and reversed a Portland, Ore. district court's order exempting a company from compliance with the AAA walnut control act. The act requires growers to contribute a percentage of their crop to a control board or to make payments in lieu thereof; for the right to engage in interstate commerce; failure to contribute limits non-conformers to dealing in intrastate commerce only. The firm claimed the provision as unconstitutional. Justice William Denman, in writing the opinion, claimed no constitutional rights had been violated, and pointed out the order was designed to create a parity in the price of unshelled walnuts by diminishing the supply in the consuming markets with a consequent price raise.

A significant passage in the opinion said "... the fact that in attaining price parity, it may be deemed necessary to give some or all of the surplus to indigent persons, does not make the requirement unlawful. It cannot be said that such a disposition has no reasonable relation to the lawful objectives of the agricultural adjustment act ..."

ESPEE ABANDONS COOS BAY TRACK

WASHINGTON, Sept. 22.—(AP)—The Southern Pacific railway asked the interstate commerce commission today for permission to abandon operation over 18.78 miles of track between Myrtle Point and Powers, Ore., on December 1. The trackage is owned by the Coos Bay Lumber company and the Southern Pacific said traffic was insufficient.

SEATTLE WELFARE DIRECTOR QUILTS

SEATTLE, Sept. 22.—(AP)—Kenneth R. Wadleigh, King county welfare director since March, 1937, resigned today, effective September 30. In a letter to county commissioners, Wadleigh referred to the conflict between the commission and the state social security department over welfare funds, and said he no longer could "serve two masters."

Wadleigh, 36, is a University of Oregon graduate. He was a "troubleshooter" for the state department before coming here as county director. Relief organizations have criticized his administration.

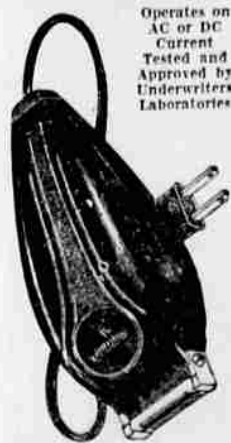
