

ITALY PARCELS ETHIOPIAN LAND IN FARM PLOTS

Ex-Service Men Are Offered
Home And 25-Acre Tract
As Order Is Restored In
Conquered Africa Empire

ROME (UP)—Italian ex-servicemen with a yen for pioneer farming are being offered grants of land in Ethiopia by their government.

This offer is now being made through the Italian Ex-servicemen's Foundation which has already taken over 3,000 hectares (1,215 acres) of land. Before the end of the year it will take over another 9,000 hectares (3,465 acres) for a total of 12,000 hectares (4,800 acres). This farming land is situated on the Ogdisa and Bahrta regions, west of Addis Ababa.

It will be distributed among 200 war veterans and their families. Each grant will measure approximately 60 hectares (25 acres). Some time will be required, however, before the land can receive the new soldier farmers.

The foundation has a big job on its hands. It must clear much of the land of virgin forests; it must distribute drinking water and construct colonial houses.

Three Room Houses

These will consist of three rooms, the largest being arranged as a kitchen. The others will be bedrooms. The kitchen will open on a small veranda. These houses will measure 350 square yards and cost \$5,500 lire each to construct.

The total outlay involved for the execution of the scheme is estimated at \$3,300,000 lire (\$268,500), including an additional five percent for unforeseen expenses and 15 percent for general expenses.

Crop distribution will be so arranged so that about one-twentieth of the land lying nearest the house will be allotted to vegetables, orchards and vineyards, while the remainder farthest from the house will be used for pasturage.

Opposite the houses will be the native tukuls. They too, will be grouped together. The colonial houses will be arranged in groups of eight in order to keep the cost of general services within certain limits, thus facilitating supplies of raw materials and the sale of farm products.

Ethiopia Now Orderly

Meanwhile, there is evidence that order has been restored in Ethiopia. It is found in the publication of new regulations permitting the free circulation of Italian citizens throughout the empire.

Until now Italians were not permitted to go to East Africa except as colonists and in every case taken directly to the region where they were to become their new home. These precautions had to be taken because of the high percentage of brigandage and pillaging still committed by roving rebel bands.

The new regulations have been issued with the intention of allowing Italian citizens to circulate freely between one territory and another. Italians will be permitted to circulate in all the territories of Italian East Africa, providing they have documents to prove their identity.

CROP INSURANCE TO SAVE FARMERS

RELIEF VOTE APT TO CRUSH PARTY THAT CREATED IT

WASHINGTON, Sept. 22.—(UP)—Gov. George D. Aiken of Vermont, potential candidate for the Republican presidential nomination in 1940, warned the federal relief system may become a "great political Frankenstein, extremely dangerous to those who created it."

"The twelve to thirteen million unemployed in this nation, with their friends and relatives, can control a national election," Aiken wrote in his book, "Speaking From Vermont," just published.

"The federal relief system appears to be a mighty political juggernaut and an unstable one," he said. "Admittedly this great body of voters can control an election. By controlling it one way they can bind themselves to twelve dollars a week and broken morale for another term of years; or they can use their power of numbers to vote themselves the chance for real jobs."

"They will again vote for the party that offers handouts unless there is some other alternative."

He told Republicans their cue is not to denounce or cut off relief, but to find means to make it unnecessary.

JAPANESE ARMS TO REACH HANKOW SOON, PREDICTION

SHANGHAI, Thursday, Sept. 22.—(UP)—Japanese armies closing in on Hankow will occupy the provisional Chinese national capital within a week, an authoritative Japanese military observer told the United Press today.

Foreign military experts agreed with this prediction "unless unexpected floods or unusual storms block the Japanese advance."

Chinese military dispatches admitted the Japanese were closing in on Chinese Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek's capital "on all fronts."

Despite continued rains the Japanese had thrown new power into their offensives during the past 24 hours and were almost within cannon range of Sianyang station 100 miles north of Hankow.

They had captured Loehnan and started a tightening movement along the whole of their whole line from a point just east of Sianyang through Kwangchow (Hwangchow) and Shiangchow and thence southward to the Yangtze river.

PORTLAND, Sept. 22.—(AP)—Contracts for all major transmission line construction to be financed with a recent \$10,000,000—odd PWA grant will be awarded early in October, Bonneville Administrator J. D. Ross said yesterday.

Engineers are now studying bids for cable on the first 30-mile link of the Bonneville-Grand Coulee line. Bids were: Phelps Dodge Copper Production company, \$155,188.08; Aluminum Company of America, \$121,452.65; Amnoda Wire and Cable company, \$112,466.84; General Cable corporation, \$174,173.32.
