REPLACEMENTS IN CCC RANKS COMING

WASHINGTON, Sept. 29.—(AP)—The civilian conservation corps announced today state directors had been ordered to select 49,497 men between October 1 and October 20 to fill vacancies. Director Robert Fackner said this was about 75 per cent of the number required to bring the CCC to its maximum strength of 800,000. He said the labor department reported there would be about 235,000 applicants for enrollment during October. He estimated not more than a fourth of this number could be taken.
