**Warehouse Tieup Conference Waits Upon Employers**

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 30.—(AP)—The conference between the warehousemen's union and the distributors of San Francisco was delayed today while the employers awaited a formal statement from the union concerning a proposed settlement of the warehouse tieup.

The employers, in newspaper advertisements, proposed the men return to work immediately during negotiations provided the union agreed in principle to a single contract for the whole warehouse industry, the chief point at issue in the dispute.

Meanwhile the "hot boxes" which caused the closing of many warehouses because employees refused to handle the school supplies on the ground it was loaded by "strikebreakers," was shut down to a siding. Status of the department store strike remained the same, with the stores operating and picket lines continuing. The strike committee announced the death of a picket captain, George Chavez, 59, from a heart attack.

Chavez, a veteran department store employee, was survived by his widow and 10 children.
