CHINESE LEADER DIES BY HATCHET

SHANGHAI, Sept. 30.—(AP)—Tang Shao-Yi, former Chinese revolutionary leader and first premier of the Chinese republic, died today after an operation to remove a hatchet buried in his skull.

Three assassins gained entrance to the home of the 78-year old retired official on the pretext they were presenting him with honorary scrolls. They pulled hatchets from the scrolls and attacked him, escaping in a stolen automobile which they later abandoned.

Recently there have been rumors in Shanghai, that Tang, one of the first American educated Chinese, was negotiating with Japanese for a possible connection with a Japanese-sponsored government, but such rumors have been denied.

COUNTY OFFICERS' DEMURRERS FEHL SUIT ARE UPHeld

In an order on file in circuit court today, Judge H. D. Norton sustains demurrers to the complaint in the \$200,000 damage suit of Earl H. Fehl against County Clerk George R. Carter, Assistant District Attorney George Neilson and George Coddling, former district attorney.

Sustaining of the demurrers wipes the case off the court calendar unless the plaintiff takes further action. The court allowed Fehl ten days in which further to plead.

The demurrers contended there were not sufficient facts stated in the complaint to constitute a cause of action. The defendants were represented by Attorney Coddling. Fehl was represented by his guardian ad litem, Attorney H. B. Duncan. Fehl is now in the state hospital for the insane. He filed his damage suit last November 13, alleging the three defendants conspired to oust him as county judge, send him to prison and ruin his family.

In another phase of the involved Fehl litigation, Judge Norton overruled a motion by Attorney T. J. Enright to set aside a court order appointing Duncan as Fehl's guardian ad litem. The court order said Fehl and his counsel had been given time to submit the name or names of a guardian acceptable to them and had failed to do so.
