COURAGEOUS CUBS BLAST CARDS TO WIN TITLE RACE

Pirates Collapse and Reds Score Easy Win in Wild Game.

SPORTSMAN'S PARK, St. Louis, Oct. 1.—(AP)—The Chicago Cubs, crippled but courageous, sewed up their third National league pennant in seven years by plastering the St. Louis Cardinals, 10 to 3, in the second game of a wild-eyed doubleheader here today while their last rivals, the Pittsburgh Pirates, were bowing in Cincinnati.

The victory, scored in a 17-hit attack on four St. Louis pitchers, placed Gabby Hartnett's scaggers two full games ahead of the Pirates and placed tomorrow's concluding game in the light of an exhibition. It climaxed the pennant surge which saw the Cubs, standing fourth only two months ago, win 21 of their last 25 games and outgame the opposition.

HUSKIES TIED BY IDAHO IN UPSET; ROY SMITH HERO

SEATTLE, Oct. 1.—(AP)—University of Idaho Vandals, a tough gang of Pacific coast conference orphans, made the touted University of Washington football team look like anything but the championship contenders today when they fought the Huskies to a 12 to 12 tie and left 20,000 spectators in the Washington stadium shocked and dazed.

Washington, heralded far and wide as the team to beat this season for its conference title and Bowl representation, twice saw a great and powerful Idaho machine come from behind and tie up the count—the first time in the second period and the last time two minutes before the end of the battle.

It was the greatest achievement for an Idaho team against Washington in 31 years. Back in 1907 the Vandals held the Huskies to a scoreless tie, and only twice have they emerged victorious—in 1900 and 1905.
