

WAGE-HOUR BOARD WILL SOON ISSUE ITS REGULATIONS

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14.—(AP)—The wage-hour administration will issue general definitions and regulations soon to clarify application of the new labor standards law...

One of the first announcements will define learners, apprentices, handicapped workers and messengers, who the wage-hour act says may be paid less than the statutory minimum of 8 cents an hour...

Officials said, however, these definitions would not be specific enough to inform a large manufacturing company, for example, whether an individual employee would be subject to minimum wage provisions of the law.

Elmer F. Andrews, wage-hour administrator, and his legal staff, will attempt to make more specific rulings in response to individual requests from industries or workers in doubt about the application of the law to their occupations.

The administrator said, however, the courts would have to decide many questions concerning which he had "no power to make any binding ruling."

All industries in interstate commerce, except those specifically exempted, will be subject to the act. They will be obliged to pay their workers a minimum of 25 cents an hour and limit their work to a maximum of 44 hours a week.

Employers who violate the requirements will be liable for unpaid sums plus an equal amount as damages and costs of litigation.

SEAPLANE HUNTS LOST FISH BOAT

ASTORIA, Ore., Oct. 14.—(AP)—The treacherous sea off the Oregon and southern Washington coastlines was searched today by the coast guard's amphibian plane for the Portland halibut schooner Enterprise, missing since storms last week-end drove fishing boats to shelter.

The plane, after searching a strip of ocean 75 miles offshore from Cape Mearns to Leadbetter Point, landed here for refueling last night, but took up the search again today.

The craft, commanded by Captain Conrad Swenson of Portland, had a crew of three aboard.

Fishermen, unworried, blamed tardiness of the boat to a balky engine. Coast guardsmen feared heavy seas might have wrecked her.

OCTOBER RELIEF FUNDS BORROWED

CCC REPLACEMENT LIST FOR OREGON GIVEN 88 BOOST

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14.—(AP)—Robert Fechner, director of the Civilian Conservation Corps, announced today the CCC enrollment quota for the three months which started October 1 had been increased by 13,188.

He also authorized enrollment of 1867 additional project assistants, enrollees with technical qualifications for supervisory work.

These increases brought the replacement enrollment quota for the quarter to 88,516, sufficient to bring the total enrollment up to the authorized 300,000.

The labor department told Fechner state selecting agencies reported more than 235,000 applicants for enrollment.

Fechner announced these increases in project assistant quotas by corps areas, and in regular enrollment by states:
