

DISTRICT RALLY OF BOY SCOUTS SET FOR TONIGHT

Public Invited to Attend Senior High Gym Event at 7:29 P. M.

Hundreds of Scouts and their leaders are all set for tonight's big district rally being held at the Medford

high school gymnasium, according to Seth M. Bullis, Medford district chairman. Thousands of invitations have been given to parents and friends throughout the Rogue River valley. The public is invited and urged to attend. Scouting activities will be demonstrated in first aid, pyramid building, signaling, fire-by-friction, and fire by flint and steel. Two of the outstanding demonstrations for tonight will be the practice disaster mobilization and the home-made chariot race. Chariot drivers are dressing befittingly of their role with Scout stunts grooming for the event. Scout singing and cheering will earn additional points for each troop. There is a possible maximum of 2400 points available if a troop has a perfect score. The district rally, which is the third of the annual scouting activities in Medford will attract hundreds of interested citizens. The

doors will open at 7 p.m. and the program with "Begin on Time" or "Punctuality" at the unusual hour of 7:29 p.m. One hundred points are given to those troops with 100 per cent of their Scout leader membership present for the roll call at 7:29. CONVICTED LABOR TERRORISTS WILL SEEK NEW TRIAL

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 14.—(AP)—Two Pacific coast chieftains of the powerful AFL teamsters' union, convicted of criminally conspiring to direct a campaign of terrorism in the southern California trucking industry, today placed their hope of escaping a prison in arguments for a new trial to be heard next Wednesday.

A superior court jury, which took

three days to reach a verdict after a three month trial, last night convicted Harry W. Dail, the union's international organizer, and Dexter L. Lewis, local president, of felonies. Dail, former Seattle public official and lieutenant of teamster leader Dave Beck, was acquitted of five specific assault offenses and of one extortion count. An identical verdict was returned for Lewis, formerly of South Dakota, who came here 10 years ago, expecting to play football at the University of Southern California, but became a truck driver.

Two other union members, Dewey Copeland and David Belanger, were convicted of misdemeanor assault charges, punishable by jail sentences or fines, or both.

Five unionists—George A. Schultz, former local secretary-treasurer; Richard King, Michael O'Brien, Thomas Pitts and Philip Watler—were acquitted.

The case was one of the most

sensational in Los Angeles labor annals. Prosecution witnesses testified goon squads were organized to beat non-union and rival union truck drivers, and employers were threatened with illegal strikes.

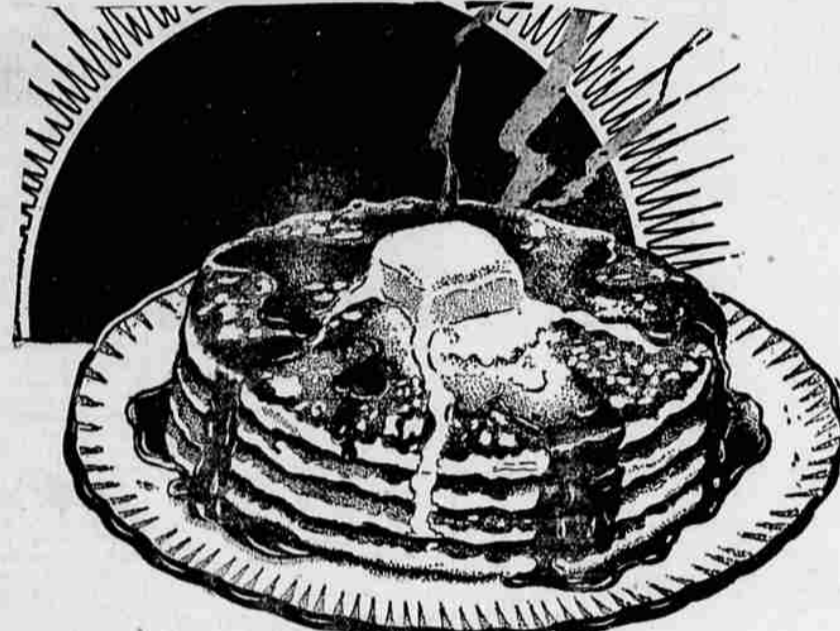
The nine defendants maintained they were innocent of violent activities. Two other defendants turned state's evidence. Paul McKnight, who confessed to a series of beatings, is to be sentenced October 20. Walter H. Burros was freed at the request of the district attorney's office.
