

CURB ON JEWISH IMMIGRATION TO PALESTINE ROILS

JERUSALEM, Oct. 14.—(AP)—Jews in Palestine holding United States citizenship made plans today for an early conference of all Jewish-American investors in the Holy Land to express to Great Britain and the United States opposition against any restrictions on Jewish immigration into Palestine.

Spokesmen for the 8,000 to 9,000 American Jews in Palestine said they intended to appeal to the British government not to break pledges of the Balfour declaration and the League of Nations mandate.

On the basis of the Balfour declaration promising Jews a homeland in Palestine, the spokesmen said, American Jews invested some \$40,000,000 in industrial, commercial and agricultural enterprises in the Holy Land.

The Jewish agency for Palestine replied to a warning by the Palestine Arab defense committee with the declaration further killings would not deter the Zionist movement.

The Arab committee on Monday warned Jews "in Palestine and in other Arab and eastern nations" to expect grave trouble if the Zionist movement persisted in further immigration into Palestine.

"There was a widespread belief a climax was fast approaching in the Palestine crisis, in which disorders in the past 12 weeks are unofficially estimated to have claimed 1,850 casualties, including more than 800 lives.

JAPAN DRIVE IN SOUTH CHINA TO HURT YANK TRADE

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14.—(UP)—Japanese military operations based on Hainan, if successful, will reduce further the United States' already dwindling trade with China, and spread diplomatic tension from the Sino-Japanese struggle throughout a wide region of south-eastern Asia, international experts here pointed out tonight.

The railway from Kowloon (near Hong Kong) to Canton, presumed to be an early objective of Japanese strategy, is a present "life line" for transportation of supplies from the seaboard to Canton and thence into the interior of nationalist China.

If and when this line is cut, the United States stands to lose a large part of the commerce with China which is routed via Hong Kong, as there is little likelihood this could be moved in present volume over alternative unestablished routes or motor highways.

At the same time the cutting of this railway would create an imperative necessity for the Chinese nationalists to obtain more supplies from French Indo-China and Burma (British) by way of Yunnan province of southwestern China. Success of Japanese operations against the Kowloon-Canton route would also tend to "isolate" British Hongkong from the interior of China.

The Philippines (American) may feel certain "sympathetic" effects of the South China military operations due to the close commercial connections between Canton merchants and the Chinese merchants of the Philippines, and also due to the expected board commercial shifts and adjustments which the new situation may require throughout South China.

DUCK STAMP SALE SETS NEW RECORD

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14.—(AP)—Sale of federal "duck stamps" which migratory fowl hunters are required to purchase each year, reached a new annual high during the fiscal year ended June 30.

The biological survey announced sales totaled 783,039, or almost 150,000 above the next highest year of 1934-35, when the annual series was first started.

The stamps cost a dollar each, and although they are used primarily by migratory fowl hunters, large numbers are sold to stamp collectors.

Minnesota led state sales for the 1937-38 series, with Wisconsin, Michigan, California, Illinois, Texas and Washington, following in order.

The 1938-39 stamps now are on sale at postoffices and county seats. Figures on sales from July 1, 1937, to June 30, 1938, included:

Alaska, 1,040; Idaho, 10,138; Montana, 15,284; Oregon, 19,640; Washington, 41,060.

CATHOLIC CHURCH HOLD ENEMIES IN REICH PLAN RUIN

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14.—(AP)—The committee for Catholic refugees from Germany said today enemies of the church in the Reich were seeking its complete destruction.

In a report to the meeting of the hierarchy in the United States, now being held at the Catholic university, the committee added it had handed 1,276 refugee cases between January, 1937, and October, 1938. Some of the refugees, it said, were settled here, while homes for others were found in the South America and Europe.

Church persecution in Austria since the Anschluss, the committee said, has been more ruthless than it was in Germany in the early months of the Nazi regime.

"People are not everywhere forbidden to attend their church services," the committee continued "but it is made practically impossible for them by the fact that they have to attend meetings of the party which coincide with church activities."

"In some parts of Germany the Nazis have dared go further and have demanded publicly Catholics should step out of the church under threat of economic or social loss. Employees have lost their position, laborers have been dismissed and Catholic students have been excluded from colleges and universities."

NEW WARNING NET HALTS AIR ATTACK, EXERCISES SHOW

PORT BRAGG, N. C., Oct. 14.—(AP)—A civilian warning net, functioning with military precision after four days and nights of exercises, today enabled pursuit squadrons defending this base to intercept two bombardment flights simulating an attack from the Atlantic ocean.

Demonstration of the ability of such a civilian set-up to provide information rapidly enough to permit accurate interception of bombardment missions was pronounced by high officers one of the most important developments of a week of air-defense exercises here.

A high spot of the exercises came last night, when a million residents of eastern North Carolina learned how to defend themselves against air raids by means of the "blackout."

Residents of approximately 15,000 square miles, including 67 towns in 21 eastern North Carolina counties, turned off their home, factory and store lights as big army "flying fortresses" and accompanying planes flew at a high altitude toward Fort Bragg.

Commanding officers said the greatest difficulty of the ground force was caused by automobiles on the highways. They asserted pilots could follow the stream of lights to a point where all was dark, indicating the presence of a "blackout" town. Generally, though, the cooperation of civilians was "splendid," the officers said, and probably would go a long way toward thwarting an invading aerial fleet that was not familiar with the territory.

CZECHS INCREASE DANUBE PATROLS

KOMAROM, Hungary, (on the Czechoslovak border), Oct. 14.—(AP)—Czechoslovakia sent troop reinforcements eastward into Ruthenia tonight and strengthened her army along the Danube in an effort to halt spreading frontier and internal troubles.

Hundreds of persons in autonomous Ruthenia started demonstrations for union of that section of Czechoslovakia with Hungary.

Thousands of Hungarian troops occupying the Czechoslovak towns of Polyzag and Batoralja timely under agreement between the two governments stood ready to make further advances.

There was no official estimate of

the number of Hungarians under arms, but it was known Hungary had moved at least 12,000 men into Komarom in addition to troops already there.

On the Czechoslovak side of the town which straddles the Danube river, thousands demonstrated for cession of the area to Hungary. All Hungarian flags were torn down by Czechoslovak nationalists. Stores were closed and many residents were afraid to leave their homes.
