NAZI TRADE GAIN WAKES UP J. BULL BUSINESS RETURN

LONDON, Oct. 15.—(AP)—Swift German trade expansion on the heels of Nazi political victories in central Europe is compelling British industrial leaders to face the necessity of a new economic rearmament within the empire.

A lingering business recession is forcing them to take action to prevent what the more pessimistic observers believe might become a serious collapse.

On the second front, Britain wants to have other good customers like the United States, Soviet Russia and Argentina buy more British goods under threats of cutting down purchases in those countries.

Already there is talk of complete Turkish-German cooperation in a new Turkish four-year plan, excluding Britain. Germany signed a trade agreement with Turkey a week ago, establishing German credit of about \$80,000,000 compared to the credit of \$60,000,000 given recently by Britain.

In both cases, as far as is known, the credits must be liquidated through exchange of goods.

There also are reports that Germany ultimately expects to control the political-economic fate of the near east, including the vast Arab populations, collaboration with Italy, again excluding Britain.

A. F. L. CONVENTION OPPOSES TAXATION AIMED AT CHAINS

HOUSTON, Texas.—(Special)—The attention of business interests throughout the nation was focused upon the 16th annual convention of the American Federation of Labor here Friday in view of definite action taken against proposed chain store taxation. In the Friday sessions, labor delegates went on record as unanimously opposing what was termed "discriminatory taxation of chain stores" in two important resolutions.

Holding that chain store taxes are "punitive, discriminatory and confiscatory in intent" and that they materially affect employment and living costs, the American Federation of Labor passed by unanimous vote the report of its legislative committee and instructed the executive council to take active steps to combat such taxation.

It was the pattern bill in congress that inspired this action, the A. F. L. convention was, it was pointed out, such legislation would tax chain stores as high as \$49,000 a year per store.

It was the view of labor officials that this bill aimed at the "destruction of one big form of retail distribution that commonly is known as the chain store system." It was maintained that destruction of chain store operation would "disturb and dislocate the employment and working conditions of all those directly or indirectly employed." The interests of the general public were also cited in view of the asserted fact that chain store operations result in lower prices for the necessities of life.

Another resolution adopted by the convention identified with the chain store tax study accused certain business groups of "shifting their burdens to others" and "classified certain forms of taxation as "discriminatory and confiscatory in intent."

FLOWER SALE TO AID BLIND, PLAN

A street flower sale is to be conducted throughout Medford on Saturday, October 22, under the auspices of the American Brotherhood for the Blind, a national, non-sectarian, non-profit organization who for the past 20 years has rendered the blind the service to the sightless by providing Braille books and magazines entirely without charge. The brotherhood also maintains a field service department, sponsors the sale of articles made by the blind, supplies white canes especially designed for their use, provides Braille writing equipment, assists blind students and workers, arranges for transportation and guides, furnishes counsel and information, and endeavors as far as possible to relieve the handicap of blindness. All of the brotherhood's services, as well as its publications, are available free to the blind everywhere.

The flowers which blind girls make in their own homes will be sold on the streets and at the homes by local girls and boys for whatever anyone wishes to contribute to a very worthy cause.

Headquarters for the sale will be at the public library children's room. Miss Virginia Blais is in charge of sale and finances.
