

Belcastro and Murdock to Resume Bitter Grappling Feud Tonight

ITALIAN BAD MAN SEEKING REVENGE FROM TEXAS LAD

Ladies Night Repeat Expected To Fill Armory—Knox, LaDue And Carr, Karlirko In Matches.

Pete Belcastro and Paul Murdock resume their bitter, slam-bang wrestling feud in the Medford armory tonight before what is expected to be the largest outpouring of spectators in the past six months. It's ladies night again, with every purchaser of a ringside or balcony ticket receiving a free ticket to admit a feminine fan, and promoter Mack Lillard reports the advance sale is exceptionally fine. Murdock, the thunderbolting Texan who surprised hundreds of fans last Monday by walloping Belcastro in a savage match, expects to repeat his triumph this evening, and keep his Medford record clear of defeat. A clean grappler, Paul proved that he could withstand Belcastro's dynamic attack and have enough left to apply his thunderbolt maneuver, and what he did once he sincerely believes he can do again.

Last week saw the villainous Belcastro lose his first wrestling match in Medford this year, and to state that he is fighting mad would be putting it mildly. The Weed bad man is determined to even the score with his clean wrestling opponent, and plans to do it with his bouncing surfboard, which he was unable to apply last Monday.

Like the main event, the two lower bouts will feature meanie versus meanie, with LaDue attempting to foul Knox into submission in the middle event and Karlirko turning on the heat against the popular Charley Carr in the opener.

Klamath Shows Power But Not Invincibility

It was with a mixture of emotions that this writer watched Snowy Gustafson's Klamath Pelicans beat Ashland's Grizzlies, 27 to 0, Friday night.

At times during the ball game, which was much closer than the score indicates, the Klamathites seemed to have that vital spark you find in all great football teams. At other times, the undefeated Pelicans looked like just another prep aggregation, good but far from great.

There is no getting away from the fact that Gustafson has a fine club this season, one that will give Medford's Black Tornado probably its hardest encounter next Friday night under the local stadium lamps. But, when they start tabbing the Pelicans a "wonder team," a "team of destiny," and "state champions," which has been done in some circles, we must give vent to several "cut-throat" remarks.

Klamath Falls is a hard-souled, smooth-working and highly-gearred grid machine. It's forward wall is exceptionally well-coached; it changes fast and hard and blocks sharply and rather savagely. Pelican backs are all small but fleet of foot, and Halfback Anaker and Quarterback Angus are distinct breakaway threats, climax runners who are pure dynamite.

One springing surprise of several matches below the line of scrimmage is the Pelicans' employ both a line and backfield shift on offense, and almost every play is developed from ball-handling hocus-pocus behind the line, single and double reverses, half and full spinners and other football magic.

There is no doubt but that the Klamath Falls backfield is bottled TNT, and that when the forward wall pulls the cork by opening holes there are touchdowns spewed all over the lot. As a whole, the Pelican ball-carrying quartet is probably the speediest and trickiest to operate in the Southern Oregon conference in several years.

Revealed in the Ashland game, however, were several weaknesses, which combine to keep the Pelicans several notches below the "great team" status. For instance, although the Pelican line blocks in fine style at the scrimmage point, it's downfield mopping-up is far from perfect. Anaker raced 69 yards to a touchdown against Ashland on the third play of the game, but he did so because of his own ability. Every Ashland secondary man had a shot at him, but couldn't bring him to earth. The point is, Anaker didn't have a clear field when he got into the open. His line sprung him through, then left him on his own.

On defense, the Klamath line was a long way from resembling a stone wall. The Grizzlies haven't any straight-ahead power to speak of, but time after time Lee, Harris and Charlie Warren cracked through the Pelican wall for nice gains. The first half the Grizzlies literally ripped the Klamath line to shreds, but naturally couldn't shove it over when they got inside the 10-yard stripe and Klamath used an eight-man line. It is true that Klamath has had only six points scored against it in five games, but not one of those opponents—Hill Military, Lakeview, The Dalles, Grants Pass and Ashland—could drive to a touchdown through a paper bag.
