

ANNIVERSARY OF YORKTOWN FIGHT MARKED BY S.A.R.

The Southern Oregon Chapter of the Oregon Society, Sons of the American Revolution met in the First Presbyterian church last evening in celebration of the 17th anniversary of the battle of Yorktown.

A dinner served by ladies of Grace Circle preceded the program. A very good representation of the members of the chapter were present, representing Grants Pass, Klamath Falls and Medford.

Attorney A. C. Hough of Grants Pass, first vice president of the chapter, gave an interesting resume of the events leading up to and a graphic word picture of the "Surrender of Lord Cornwallis at Yorktown."

Citing the battle of Yorktown and the progression and retrogression of events leading up to our present day, Frank Hull spoke in glowing and eloquent terms on "better advance to patriotism" basing his remarks on the law of Moses, stating that "the spirit that organized this government was another law of Moses."

ROLL CALL SET BY RED CROSS

Annual American Red Cross roll-call with open on Armistice Day, November 11, and continue through Thanksgiving Day, November 24. It was announced here today by George T. Frey, chairman of Jackson county chapter.

The goal for the 34 chapters in Oregon this year has been set at 70,000 members, the national objective being six million adult members. Mr. Frey said. Enrollment of 64,715 members in Oregon last year was a gain of 8,976 or 16 per cent over the membership of the previous year.

ASHLAND RENEWS COPCO CONTRACT

ASHLAND, Oct. 20.—(Sp.)—Contract between the City of Ashland and the California Oregon Power company was renewed for five years at Tuesday night's regular council meeting. The extended contract is virtually the same as the present one.

Under the contract the city power supply will continue to be supplemented by purchase of current from the company. The contract provides a rate of nine mills for the first 50,000 kilowatt hours per month and eight mills for the next 50,000.
