

MARTIN TO STAY OUT OF CAMPAIGN FRIENDS DECLARE

Sprague Supporters Feel Governor's Endorsement Would Help Hess—Ickes Facing Cool Reception

SALEM, Oct. 21.—(P)—Those who hoped Governor Martin would take part in the gubernatorial race between Charles A. Sprague, Republican, and Henry L. Hess, Democrat, might just as well give up. During the past two weeks there has been much talk about a possible endorsement of Sprague by the governor. Here's how it all started.

A couple of weeks ago the governor made an offhand remark at a press conference that he had "just put some eggs under the old hen and they would hatch in a few days." This remark was interpreted in some quarters as meaning the executive would come out against Hess, who defeated him in the primary.

Meant Moody Report

But Tuesday the bubble burst when the governor released the Moody report on the prosecution of Oregon's war on labor terrorism. This was the hatching of the eggs.

Persons close to the governor say he will stay out of the campaign. "The governor knows better than to act like a clown in endorsing Sprague," one of the persons said. "We feel, and many prominent Sprague supporters agree, that an endorsement of Sprague would help Hess. People just don't like to see Democrats monkeying in Republican affairs."

The governor remains bitter toward Hess, but he doesn't plan to say a word against him. Martin feels that he has no business taking part in a campaign in which he isn't involved personally.

He never got over Secretary Ickes' endorsement of Hess during the turbulent Democratic primary. Ickes said Martin was "at heart no New Dealer." Martin retaliated by calling Ickes "Washington's No. 1 thunderbug and a renegade mugwump Republican."

Ickes Coming Sunday

Ickes will be in Oregon Sunday, but the governor won't be on hand to greet him.

"If Ickes wants to inspect the capitol (a PWA project under Ickes) it will be closed, as it always is on Sunday. I won't be around to receive him because I have to go to church," the governor said with his famous twinkle in his eye.

There is a possibility that Ickes will make a speech favoring Hess, whom he has endorsed again. But if Ickes mentions the governor in an uncompromising manner, the governor probably will answer.

"If Ickes spouts off too much, the governor will take another crack at him. But the governor's answer will not mention the candidates either of Sprague or Hess," a close friend of the governor said.

No Comment On Report

The governor had no comment on the report of Ralph E. Moody, whom

he appointed to prosecute labor terrorism cases. While the report was a stinging denunciation of a few labor leaders who have gone to prison for labor racketeering, it was virtually without political significance since it mentioned no candidates.

The report, however, hinted that the governor and Moody are behind the initiative measure to regulate picketing and boycotting. Moody warned that there would be a recurrence of labor terrorism unless such legislation were enacted.

Interest Mystifies

Election bureau officials are hard pressed to explain why the number of registered voters will equal or exceed the record total of 546,034 in the 1936 general election. This would indicate that voters are taking more of an interest in the November 8 election than they did in the presidential election two years ago.

It is apparent that the Republicans will hold a 10,000 to 15,000 lead over the Democrats in trial registration. The Democrats never have been ahead since Civil war days. In the May primary, the G. O. P. had a 16,000 majority.

LEGION WILL OBSERVE NAVY DAY WEDNESDAY IN SPECIAL PROGRAM

"Navy Day" will be observed by Medford post No. 15 of the American Legion at the next regular session, Wednesday, October 26, announced Commander Robt. Ebel today. An excellent program is planned and a special invitation is extended to all navy men, whether members of Medford post or not.

Mr. Ebel in speaking of Navy Day, stated that it was inaugurated in 1922 by the Navy League of the U. S. and its observance is sponsored an-

nually by the league. "October 27 was selected," said Commander Ebel, "because it is the anniversary of the birthday of President Theodore Roosevelt, so much of whose life was devoted to establishing a sound naval policy for the United States.

"We urge all local citizens to commemorate this important date by the display of our national colors and 100 per cent support of the splendid programs which are planned throughout the nation in schools, lodges, service clubs and elsewhere. No organization is more interested in an enduring peace than the American Legion," concluded Mr. Ebel, "and a sound naval defense will do much to keep this country free from the horrors of war."
