

NEW MEXICO WPA SCANDAL PROVES CAMPAIGN BOMB

73 Arrested On Charges of Using Relief Set-up for Political Capital - Many Prominents Are Listed

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21.—(AP)—The justice department today suspended until further notice Stanley W. P. Miller, assistant federal attorney at Albuquerque, N. M.

Miller was one of 73 persons indicted by a federal grand jury yesterday on charges of conspiring to defraud the government in use of WPA labor and materials in New Mexico.

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., Oct. 21.—(AP)—New and further reaching actions were hinted today to be impending in the wake of federal grand jury indictments returned here late yesterday against 73 persons charged with making political capital of the New Mexico WPA.

Densens prominent in state politics and government were indicted on charges of conspiracy to defraud the government for political purposes, among them Assistant U. S. Dist. Atty. Stanley W. P. Miller, son-in-law of Sen. Dennis Chavez, two Democratic county chairmen, Mrs. Anita Tafaya, senator Chavez's sister, Mrs. J. A. Werner, wife of the Albuquerque postmaster, and former state WPA Administrator Fred Healy.

Agents of the WPA division of investigation under Special Agent C. E. Gorman, who have worked a month with the grand jury, were still on the investigation. The grand jury action, which concluded a month of carefully veiled inquiry, fell like a bombshell in New Mexico's heated political campaign.

Federal Judge Colin Neblett, who demanded the probe September 7 with instructions to spare no one, ordered the defendants brought before him next Tuesday and directed they post \$1000 bond each. He ordered the jurors held subject to the call of the court after commending them as "good American citizens."

That additional action may follow was also seen in Judge Neblett's refusal to adjourn the grand jury in view of possible future "findings" by "federal agencies."

Severe Condemnation The grand jury report bristled with condemnation. "The extent to which the avowed ends and aims of the works progress administration program have been impeded and defeated through selfish aims and ambitions of individuals entrusted with its administration or who sought political advantage, has amazed your grand jury," the report said.

The jury declared that "many of those in positions of honor and trust have failed in creating and maintaining respect for themselves and the government which they are under oath to represent."

PRETENDER'S SON SPRINGS SURPRISE PARIS, Oct. 21.—(AP)—The Count of Paris, son of the Duke of Guise, pretender to the French throne, fled to the vicinity of Paris today in defiance of the law and issued a manifesto calling upon France to restore the monarchy for "her salvation."

Soon after handing the manifesto to newspapermen, who met him at a farmhouse near Paris, the count took off for Belgium where he lives in exile with his father.

It was the first time the 30-year-old count, who was born in Belgium, had set foot on the soil of the land his ancestors ruled.

TAX INCREASE PLANS STUDIED TO PAY FOR ARMAMENT INCREASE

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21.—(AP)—Congressional tax experts are studying several proposals for increasing income taxes to finance an expanded armament program.

These experts—staff members of the joint committee on internal revenue—will make recommendations for tax legislation at the next session of congress.

Informed persons said an emergency 10 per cent increase in income taxes was one method under consideration. The increase would apply to both individual and corporate incomes. On the basis of this year's revenue estimates, it would yield an additional \$200,000,000.

The authorities said the additional levy would be imposed for only a year or two, and would expire automatically at the end of the designated period.

Great Britain, with sharply mounting rearmament costs, already has adopted a similar emergency levy. Chairman Walsh (D-Mass.) of the senate naval affairs committee said he believed congress should have a complete picture of joint army and navy air defense needs before it acts on the separate war and navy budgets. He suggested the two services join in a report to congress.

REESE CREEK SCHOOL INSTALLS WPA UNITS

The Reese Creek school has installed WPA sanitary toilets, as approved by the Oregon state board of health, bringing to 10 the number of units installed in the county this month.

These sanitary privies are installed by the WPA at no labor cost to the individual, those wishing to replace old-type toilets with the new ones being forced to pay only the cost of the material. BALKY WPA WORKERS FIRED ON BRONX JOB

NEW YORK, Oct. 21.—(AP)—Three of a group of WPA workers who balked yesterday because they had to use both pick and shovel on a Bronx project have been fired for insubordination, WPA headquarters said today.

Out of 87 men employed on the project 83 were back at work, and the fifty-fourth man was trying to persuade officials to reinstate the ones who were discharged.

The workers objected to use of both tools, arguing one man ought to use a pick while another used the shovel.

Funeral services for Frank Herbert Reum will be held at 2 p. m. Saturday in the Perl chapel. The body will be cremated.

Mr. Reum died in his home at 922 South Oakdale avenue of a heart attack early Thursday morning after a long illness. He was 64 years old.

Although an unassuming man, Mr. Reum was prominently known in Jackson county. Quiet, he was yet extremely sociable and all who came in contact with him admired and respected him for his sterling qualities. He liked to have companions about him and those who knew him best describe him as a genuine gentleman and a true friend.

Mr. Reum was credited with showing the commercial possibilities of producing gladiolus bulbs on a profitable scale in Jackson county. He began the growing of bulbs here as an avocation, a sort of hobby, but his interests grew until he was producing bulbs on a large commercial scale.

He was born in Decorah, Iowa, on November 21, 1874. He spent his early life and procured his formal education in Iowa.

Mr. Reum was united in marriage to Miss Sarah Montgomery in Decorah on January 15, 1907. The couple moved to Canada in 1909 and came from Canada to Medford in 1931.

He was a member of the Masonic, Elks and Odd Fellows organizations. Survivors are his wife and two sons, Richard and Charles, who reside at the family home here, and two sisters and two brothers who reside in the east.

BRITISH TIGHTEN PALESTINE GRIP

JERUSALEM, Oct. 21.—(AP)—British military authorities prepared today to strike in other parts of Palestine in continuation of the campaign against rebellious Arabs.

The next scene of operations of the steel-helmeted soldiers who restored comparative order to the old quarter of Jerusalem was not disclosed, but the rebel-infested Bethlehem area was considered a likely objective.

Sporadic sniping continued in Jerusalem last night, and troops still surrounded the mosque of Omar, where many Arabs were believed to be entrenched.

Welfare workers handed out food to hungry residents of the old city, still suffering from a provision shortage. Shops were closed. Authorities started to remove refuse from shuttered bazaars as a precaution against epidemics.

ROAD COMMISSION WILL OPEN BIDS

SALEM, Oct. 21.—(AP)—Bids on nine highway projects, involving \$399,000 in construction, will be opened by

the highway commission in Portland November 17 and 18.

The nine jobs will be constructed with PWA aid. Bids on other projects also will be held, including the \$100,000 Klammath Falls grade crossing elimination project.

The PWA projects include: Douglas county—Constructing bridge on Umpqua river bridge section of the Pacific highway, \$120,000; Jackson and Josephine counties—Furnishing 7,700 yards of crushed gravel for Powers ranch-Jacksonville section of the Willamett highway and the Medford-Prill secondary highway, \$19,000.
