

RETAIL BUYING LAGS DURING MILD AUTUMN

NEW YORK, Oct. 21.—(AP)—Mild weather had an unfavorable effect on trade during the past week and retail and wholesale volumes were pulled down, said Dun & Bradstreet today in their weekly summary.

It was added, however, that "little significance was attached to the lag in the demand for some types of merchandise, as merchants were inclined to attribute the lull in sales wholly to weather conditions."

"The average decline in the week was estimated at 2 to 4 per cent, bringing the decrease from a year ago to 4 to 14 per cent."

NEW YORK, Oct. 21.—(AP)—Profit takers clung to the skirts of the stock market today but, despite this handicap, selected rails, motors, aircrafts and specialties managed to advance fractions to more than a point.

The list churned rather violently at the start without getting anywhere. Transfers were around 1,800,000 shares.

The market had plenty of constructive business items to add to the recovery side of the ledger. Especially inspiring was a jump in last week's freight loadings to a new top since last November.
