

STANDS OF TIMBER SAVED BY DISEASE CONTROL PROGRAM

Blister Rust Eradication Is Completed on Rogue Forest—Valued White and Sugar Pine Safeguarded

About 4,000,000 wild gooseberry and currant bushes were eradicated from 34,000 acres of commercially valuable white and sugar pine stands as the blister rust control program was continued the past season on the Rogue River national forest.

Work accomplished this year was summarized in a report prepared by Conrad P. Wessela, associate forester in charge of Oregon blister rust operations.

"This year's work brings the total acreage covered on the Rogue River national forest to 130,635 acres and practically completes the initial control program on this forest," Mr. Wessela said. "Occasional rapid re-eradication programs in the future will insure these fine stands of pine from the damage of this destructive tree disease."

450 Men Employed Wild gooseberry and currant bushes are the alternate host plants of the virulent blister rust disease which threatens to exterminate the white and sugar pine timber of the west.

Blister rust control activities were begun this year in May and were completed the latter part of September. About 450 men were engaged in the work, living at four camps. All workers, excepting supervisors and a small group of trained technicians, were recruited from the relief rolls of Medford, Klamath Falls, Grants Pass, Roseburg and Marshfield through cooperation of the local relief and WPA offices. Mr. Wessela's summary report stated:

Substance supplies and equipment necessary for the maintenance and operation of the camps were procured largely from local concerns and dispatched to camps through local headquarters.

Expresses Appreciation The blister rust control work in Oregon is under the jurisdiction of the U. S. bureau of entomology and plant quarantine working in cooperation with state agencies and the U. S. forest service.

On behalf of the blister rust control management Mr. Wessela expressed appreciation "for the splendid spirit of cooperation shown by officials of the local WPA office, the U. S. forest service, the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce and many other local concerns and agencies in making 1938 one of its most successful and effective seasons."

SOUTH AMERICAN TRADE EYED BY HITLER REGIME

America Finds Germany, Japan and Italy Shared in Increased Sales to Philippines Last Year

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21.—(AP)—Guarded German inquiries on commercial prospects in the Philippines produced official speculation today whether the Hitler regime was eyeing the far east as well as South America as a trade outlet.

The most recent inquiry, made by a business man described as influential in Nazi trade councils, caused government officials concerned with far eastern affairs to scan late commercial reports. They learned:

Free Trade Falls Germany, along with Japan and Italy, shared last year in increased sales to the Philippines, despite the islands' free trade ties with the United States.

Germany is building a second new ship for the Philippine government. Italy is constructing two commercial vessels for inter-island trade.

Germany has increased materially its shipping links with the islands and the far east generally, adding three of the fastest liners connecting the Orient and Europe. Italy last year made Manila a port of call for its liners.

Would Form Bloc Efforts have been made to organize the Germans living in the Philippines into a bloc, as in other foreign lands.

Regardless of immediate intentions, some officials believe Germany hopes to make future heavy trade gains in the islands and the far east generally, by capitalizing on political friendship with Tokyo.

Japan has made no secret of the intention to dominate the Orient at least commercially, and already has nibbled at Philippine-American trade in advance of the independence which congress voted to give the Philippines in 1946.

Eagles Official Killed In Crash BEND, Ore., Oct. 21.—(AP)—Colman Queen of Anacortes, Wash., deputy grand auditor for the Eagles lodge, died in a hospital here last night several hours after he was injured in an automobile accident six miles north of Madras on The Dalles-California highway.

Jefferson county authorities said Queen, former Anacortes mayor, apparently went to sleep at the wheel. His car was demolished when it left the road and struck a power pole.

Road Workers Warned SALEM, Oct. 21.—(AP)—The state highway commission warned its 1,500 employes today to refrain from any political activity during the general election campaign. Acting on a request by Governor Martin, the commission also told the employes not to make campaign contributions, pointing out this was prohibited by the corrupt practices act.
