

Marx Brothers Return To Craterian Screen In "Room Service" Today

FUNNIEST FILM TO DATE PROMISED IN ROLLING COMEDY

Absent from the screen for more than a year, the Marx Brothers make an auspicious return in what is said to be their funniest to date, "Room Service," opening a three day run today at the Craterian theatre.

A Movie Quiz picture, "Room Service" was adapted from the smash comedy that had Broadway in an uproar for more than sixty one weeks, and provides the three zanies with a ready-made story embodying the dizzy situations and rollicking complications which always fit their peculiar comedy style. And, as usual, the Marxes add some of their own ideas to the story.

In "Room Service," a shooting producer wants to stage a footlit epic—without spending a penny. (Groucho, of course). He and his cast of twenty-two put up at a splendid hotel and are \$1,200 in arrears. He lures an "angel" with \$15,000 into his trap to finance the hazardous venture. Employing ingenious methods, he and his two loyal assistants, (Harpo and Chico), struggle desperately because "the show must go on," and the result is a mirth-packed entertainment.

Story with the Marx Bros. doesn't mean a thing. It's what they do to the story that counts. The hilarious structure of the plot is built up by a series of suspense-packed highlights which keep the laughter rolling to the very end. The unexpected arrival of the author in search of his advance royalties; the baker who is tricked into financing the show; the hotel manager who regrets that he ever became the producer's brother-in-law; the hotel supervisor who finances the play without knowing it; the hectic ruses by which the madcap Marxes restrain all interference until the curtain goes up—it's one steady stream of fun-making.

In the supporting cast are Ann Miller and Lucille Ball, two of Hollywood's most promising starlets; and Frank Albertson. The other principal roles are filled by the players who created the parts for the stage play who have certainly become professional enough to know exactly how to time each comedy sequence to get the greatest laugh.

'Anne Shirley, Ruby Keeler In Dramatic Picture at Rialto

"Block-Heads," Stan Laurel and Oliver Hardy's newest full-length feature comedy, plays as the companion feature with the Wiggin masterpiece. Billy Gilbert, Minna Gombell and Patricia Ellis have roles with the two popular comers.

Leland Man Held For Possession Of Still

Ocell Critser, 35, of Leland waived preliminary hearing yesterday on a charge of possessing an unregistered still for distilling alcohol and was bound over to the federal grand jury under \$1,000 bail by U. S. Commissioner Victor A. Tengwald.

Critser was arrested in Roseburg and brought to Medford for arraignment by Paul Hanlin, U. S. deputy marshal.

Named in the same complaint as co-defendant, Critser's uncle, Walter Critser, 70, was arraigned in Portland and released on \$1,000 bail after being bound over to the grand jury. Mr. Hanlin said.

Complaining witness was A. F. Marrott, a U. S. alcohol tax investigator. It was alleged the Critsers had a 20-gallon still in their possession near Leland.
