Offerings were plentiful during most of the proceedings, but they became more insistent as the final hour neared and, for a while, the ticker tape fell behind. The list regained part of its composure subsequently, however, with steel, aircraft and rails contesting the turn-down.
Activity in low-priced shares was still pronounced, but far from as feverish as on Wednesday. Transfers were in the neighborhood of 1,900,000 shares.
