

WALLACE ACCEPTS G. O. P. CHALLENGE ON FARM POLICIES

Secretary Denounces 'Reactionary Interests' for Misrepresenting Farm Situation — Welcomes Issue

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27.—(UP)—Secretary of Agriculture Henry A. Wallace today scathingly denounced "reactionary Republican interests" for "misrepresenting" the farm situation and accepted the challenge of G. O. P. leaders to make New Deal farm policies an issue in the November 8 elections.

The cabinet officer made his attack at a press conference after he had conferred with President Roosevelt. He singled out Sen. Arthur Capper, R., Kansas, and Chairman John D. M. Hamilton of the Republican national committee for criticism, and called on all Republicans to "take a stand" on the issue.

Recent Bad Advice

"Non-cooperators have every right to resent the bad advice they received last spring from the Liberty League and from prominent Republicans, who did everything they could to get them to stay out of the farm program," Wallace said.

"Farmers who have followed such false leadership and who took bad advice now have every right to ask those false leaders to cease misrepresenting the national farm program."

He said that to quote only the present market prices for wheat, corn and cotton "grossly misrepresents the picture of farmers' returns for cash crops." Wheat farmers cooperating with the AAA received at least 18 cents a bushel above the market price available to non-cooperators, he said.

DILLINGER DOCTOR IS FOUND GUILTY

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 27.—(UP)—A jury of 10 men and two women last night found Dr. Clayton May, the "Dillinger doctor," and his nurse, Mrs. Frances Zoffel, guilty of second degree murder and conspiracy to commit an illegal operation.

May and his nurse were accused of performing an operation last April which resulted in the death of Mrs. Doris Alexander, 31.

The jury deliberated for two and one-half hours before returning their verdict, which provides for a sentence of from five years to life for May and from two to five years for Mrs. Zoffel. They will appear for sentencing Saturday.

Attorneys for the defendants served notice they would appeal the verdict.

May, who formerly lived in Minneapolis, served a two-year sentence in Leavenworth for treating John Dillinger, while the latter was an outlaw.

OLDEST MASON CLAIM DISPUTED

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 27.—(UP)—Edward W. Foy, 93-year-old Civil War veteran, disputed the claim of another today to the distinction of having been a member of the Masonic lodge for more years than anyone else in the world.

Friends of E. T. White of Port Orford had claimed the honor for him, but Foy said today he joined a year before White did.

That was 72 years ago, at Mount Morris, N. Y., Foy said. He became a master Mason September 9, 1866. He is still a member of the lodge.

Foy served during the Civil War as a member of the 9th Pennsylvania Infantry. He attended the recent reunion of Civil War veterans at Gettysburg, Pa.

HEREFORD BREEDERS TO HOLD SHOW, SALE HERE DECEMBER 3RD

CalOregon Hereford Breeders association will hold its first show and sale on December 3 at the Jackson county fairgrounds south of Medford. It was announced today by Alex Lavin, association secretary.

Plans for the show and auction were made at a meeting of the association in Valentine's cafe Tuesday. The event will be for purebred Herefords and entries are invited. Entries should be sent in immediately to Mr. Lavin at the Pionace Rock ranch, Prospect, the secretary said.

There will be classifications for steers which will be shown in pens of three. The judging will be done on December 2. The premiums will be \$50 for first, \$40 for second, \$30 for third, \$25 for fourth, \$20 for fifth, \$15 for sixth and \$10 for the rest.

All steers must be sold at auction December 3. After the steer sale the bulls and heifers will be auctioned.
