BURCH RITES SET FOR 1 SATURDAY

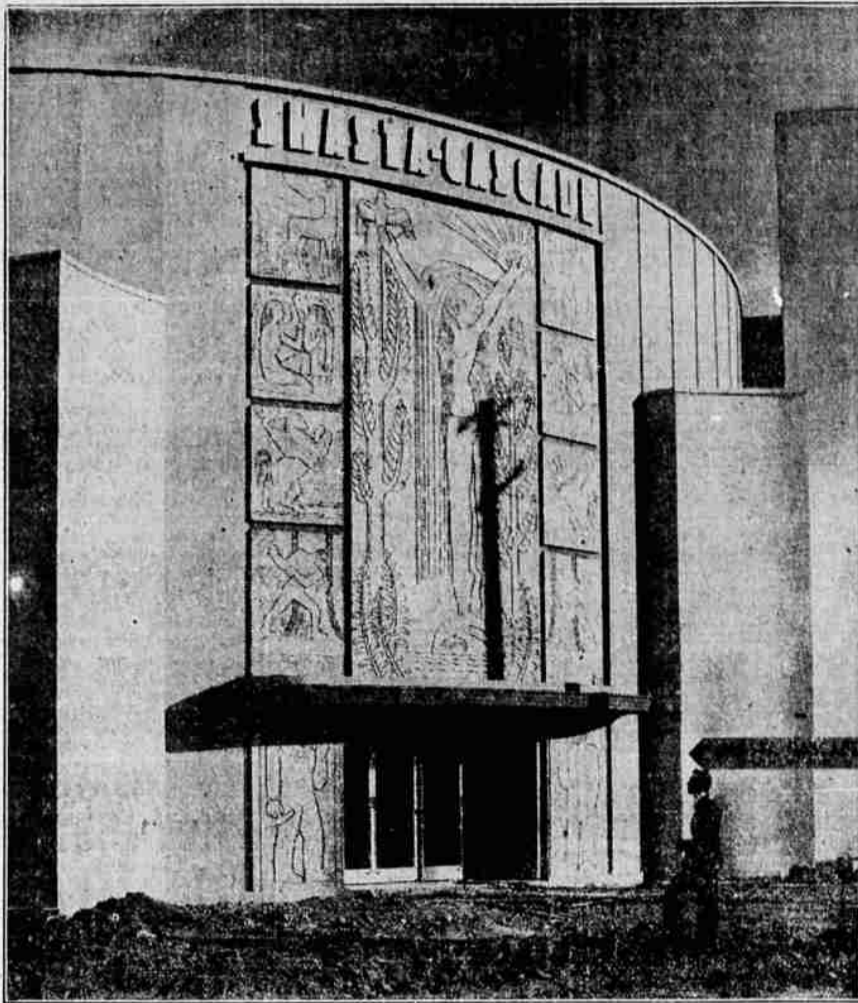

ACCIDENTAL SHOT ENTERS DWELLING

Sleeping peacefully last night, J. F. Denham and family of 124 South Grape street, were suddenly awakened at 11:40 when a bullet whistled in through a window and imbedded itself in the kitchen wall. City police were summoned hastily.

Investigation by officers revealed the shot came from the house next door, and the mystery was solved when Stancel Holt, next-door neighbor, explained that he had just taken his .25 calibre automatic pistol from a dresser drawer, and that it had discharged accidentally.

PLAN NO INQUEST IN HUNTING DEATH

The district attorney's office said today there would be no inquest into the tragic hunting accident Tuesday which cost the life of Harry Sylvester, Gallup, 20-year-old Jacksonville district youth, who was mistaken for a deer and shot by his father, just two hours before the deer season ended.

Young Gallup died in a Medford hospital 15 hours after a bullet from a .32-20 calibre rifle pierced his stomach. Before he died, he assumed all the blame for the accident, explaining that he failed to remain in a certain spot.

MEDFORD MAN AMONG MISSING

Considerable mystery surrounds the disappearance last Tuesday of George Legvillon, 36, from his place of residence in the home of Stancel Holt at 126 South Grape street, city police reported today.

Legvillon, Mr. Holt told police, left the house Tuesday and has not been seen since. All his clothes and personal effects are still in the house, Mr. Holt reported, and added that he knew of no reason why Legvillon should leave without informing him.

BLAZE DAMAGES MORGAN'S ROOF

W. P. Morgan's residence at 24 Jeannette street was damaged slightly by fire this morning as sparks from the chimney were blown down on the roof. Firemen, answering a ward alarm at 9:43, held the blaze to the roof, however, and loss was said by Chief Roy Elliott to be slight.

The fire was reported shortly after the department's chemical crew was dispatched to the home of William Holloway at 323 May street to put out a fire blaze. No damage was done.

Both fires were attributed by Chief Elliott to the strong wind. The chief counseled residents to watch stoves, heaters and furnaces carefully during periods of increased wind velocity.
