

### ASHLAND TO HAVE DIAL TELEPHONES IN COMING SPRING

#### Work to Start in Near Future On Change in Instruments—Medford to Handle Distance Business

ASHLAND, Oct. 28.—(Sp.)—Plans to install an automatic dial telephone exchange to replace the present manual switchboard in Ashland were announced Thursday by H. S. Aikins, Ashland manager for the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company.

Though no definite date has been established for placing the proposed new dial central office in service, it is understood that this will be about May 1 of next year. Work will be started in the near future by local telephone installers in changing the present manual telephones on customers' premises to dial telephones. This work is to be done on a gradual basis between now and the actual cut-over, and customers will continue to use their dial telephones as manual telephones until that time.

The new dial central office to be placed in Ashland is known as a community automatic exchange. It will provide the city with a type of telephone equipment recognized as the most modern and up-to-date now available for cities the size and location of Ashland.

With this new dial central office, all local calls will be dialed. Long distance, information, and other miscellaneous calls will be handled by direct circuits to Medford, such calls to be made by dialing "Operator."

As is customary, according to Mr. Aikins, the telephone company will provide opportunities for employment for the present Ashland operators.
