**OIL IS A JADE** which goes traipsing about underground in her own willful way—maybe to turn up miles from where she is supposed to be. That's why no instrument except the drill can tell certainly where petroleum may be found.

Nature makes oil drop by drop—at least, so it's assured. Water forces these globules to travel along an unbelievably difficult path of least resistance until they accumulate in inverted "pools."

They penetrate fissures, sands, even solid but porous rock—always gradually rising until finally trapped under a cap of rock so impervious they cannot penetrate it.

A new well taps this pressure and the oil shoots upward to the surface with more force, usually, than it will ever show again—hence the gusher of other days.

The gushers—born exhibitionists which sometimes became the complete show-off by catching fire—and the occasional many-thousand barrel well have given the public an exaggerated picture of oil production.

Few wells maintain their original flow for long. The average for more than 300,000 wells in the United States is under eight barrels a day. The popular conception of an oil well and the reality are like Mammouth Cave compared to a pin-point.

## DAVID CANFIELDS PAY VISIT HERE EN ROUTE EAST

Mr. and Mrs. David H. Canfield, former Medford residents, were renewing friendships here today prior to their departure for Washington, D. C., where they will reside for six months.

Mr. Canfield was formerly superintendent of Crater Lake national park and is now superintendent of Rocky Mountain national park with headquarters in Estes Park, Colo., one of the most important tourist centers in the national park system. He has been called to Washington for six months of special work under a new policy designed to knit the Washington administrative offices more closely with the park staffs.

On his present trip Mr. Canfield has stopped at Crater lake and the Lava Beds and Oregon Caves national monuments to view projects started under his regime as superintendent. He said that the projected building of a new lodge at Oregon Caves had been deferred.

Mr. Canfield stated that while he likes Rocky Mountain national park, he still retains a warm spot in his heart for Crater lake and southern Oregon and particularly for the friends he made here. Southern Oregon appeals to him, he said, especially because of the wide variety of scenery, ranging from desert to ocean, all of which may be seen in a few hours' drive.

Mr. Canfield said that Mr. and Mrs. Ernest A. Rostel, former Medford residents, are well and wished to be remembered to their friends here. They now live in Estes Park where Mr. Rostel is publisher for the Rocky Mountain national park, a position similar to the one he held with Crater Lake national park under Mr. Canfield's administration.

Mr. and Mrs. Canfield plan to leave here tomorrow for Washington, going to Crater lake for one more look and stopping elsewhere en route to the east.

## MRS. POST CHANGES PLANE JOURNEY DATE

Mrs. Wiley Post, scheduled to pass through Medford this afternoon on a United Mainliner from Seattle to Los Angeles, changed her plans and booked passage on a later plane, the company's office here announced. ### 195 Planes Use Port
